ONLINE ENTRIES REQUIRED FOR LIVESTOCK, POULTRY, 4-H & FFA STILL DEPTS.

For these departments, online entry closes at midnight, Thu, Sep 6, 2018.

The Entry Office will be available on Fri, Sep 7 until 10:00 A.M. to resolve required online entry issues.

Don't wait until the last minute, as there will be a fee of \$25.00 charged for this assistance.

FOR ALL OTHER DEPARTMENTS ONLINE ENTRIES WILL BE AVAILABLE FRI Sep 7, 2018.

*Save yourself the effort of filling out entry forms. Use our online entry system. Pay for your entries with a credit card. No standing in line. Receive email confirmation of all your entries. **Online entries open on Aug 7, 2018.*** Special attention should be given to the filling out of entry forms. Be sure that your name, address and city are clear on each form filed. Whenever signatures on affidavits are necessary, be sure they are supplied. Check your department, division and class numbers carefully with the Exhibitor Handbook before listing them on the entry form. Wrong department, division or class numbers appearing on entry forms can lead to disqualification if not corrected in time.

Separate entry forms must be used for each separate department. Only one department number on the same entry form. When in doubt, do not hesitate to check with the Fair Entry office (628-3421) to make sure that your entry is correct.

WALK-IN ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED MON. THROUGH FRI. 9:00 A.M. TO 5:00 P.M. AT THE ENTRY OFFICE AT BOLADO PARK FROM TUESDAY, Aug 7, 2018 THROUGH FRIDAY, Sep 7, 2018.

ABSOLUTELY NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE DATES & TIMES STATED ABOVE. UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE POSTMARKS WILL BE ACCEPTED – NO METERED MARKS ACCEPTED.

PASSES AND CREDENTIAL WRISTBANDS AVAILABLE TO LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS ONLY.

All livestock and poultry exhibitors MUST submit \$10.00 for an exhibitor's wristband when submitting their entry. No replacement wristbands will be issued. **ABSOLUTELY NO DUPLICATE PASSES WILL BE ISSUED FOR ANY REASON. WRISTBANDS MUST BE WORN ON WRIST TO BE VALID.** Parking passes required for all livestock & poultry exhibitors. Wristbands and parking passes are needed for Cooped-In Rabbit exhibitors.

Livestock Exhibitor's camping is \$150.00 per site for the Run of the Fair. Maximum of 8 campers per site. Tents are allowed without additional charge on your assigned site. Campers under 21 years old must be accompanied by parent/guardian or an adult 21 years old or older. **Copies of Motorhome/Trailer insurance and driver's license required.** All Camping will be in the upper picnic area. ALL campers will be issued camping wristbands. Admission paid wristbands (Fair or Heritage Society) will also be required to enter the fairgrounds from the campground.

All Livestock Exhibitors must enter and exit through designated gates and park in specific designated areas. Failure to abide by this ruling may cause forfeiture of all awards and monies.

California Fairs State Rules

Local Rules and Regulations

1. Exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with these rules and to abide by them. All departments in the 2018 San Benito County Fair are open to residents and producers of the 33rd District Agricultural Association (San Benito County). In case of non-residents, producers means bona fide property owners in San Benito County during 2018, the status of which will be determined by the management of the Association through inspection of the county tax records. Also, producers must regularly grow or raise the produce exhibited in San Benito County; if not, their land must be part of that owned or operated in San Benito County. All decisions will be final. Some departments have opened their entries to a wider area. Please check each department to see if other counties are eligible.

2. CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES: Entries in ALL departments must be in our office no later than 6:00 p.m. Sep 7, 2018. Postmarks will be accepted. No metered mail accepted. Make all checks payable to the 33rd District Agricultural Association (33rd DAA) **A \$20 fee will be charged on any returned check. NO refunds will be made.** On-line entries accepted until midnight Sep 6, 2018.

3. JUDGING OF EXHIBITS: Will occur between Fri, Sep 28 and Sun, Oct 3, 2018. See judging schedule on page 5 and in individual departments. American System of Judging: each work judged in competition with other entries in its class unless otherwise stated. Danish System of Judging: based upon established standards of quality for each type of product; each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets that standard rather than how it compares with other exhibits.

4. DAMAGE TO STOCK: The Board of Directors will use every precaution in their power for the safe preservation of all articles and stock on exhibition, but will not be accountable for loss or damage, whatever may be the cause or the extent of damage done. Exhibitors must give attention to their articles or animals during the Fair and at the close of the exhibition.

5. PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS: Checks will be issued for premiums as soon as possible after the close of the Fair.

6. UNDELIVERED PREMIUMS FORFEITED: All premiums awarded by the Association will be mailed to the address given on entry form. Undeliverable premiums will be forfeited to the State of California.

7. UNCLAIMED AWARDS: After 30 days, any unclaimed exhibits or awards become the property of the 33rd District Agricultural Association and may be disposed of.

8. REJECTION OF EXHIBITS: The Association reserves the right to reject any exhibit improperly entered, or when the ownership is in doubt, or **if required entry fees are lacking**, or if not properly conditioned for the show.

9. REMOVAL OF EXHIBIT: No exhibit will be removed before the date and time stated in the rules for each department as provided in State Rule II-14 and Auction Sales Rules. (Early removal will result in forfeiting any premiums due to the exhibitor. This rule will be rigidly enforced.) **Due to the possibility of loss, ribbons may not be placed on display.** Ribbons and premium checks will be available in the department when you pick up your exhibits.

10. NO DOGS, except Service Dogs or dogs entered in Dog Obedience classes on day of show only, are allowed on the fairgrounds. No exceptions.

11. CAMPING: Will be in the upper picnic area. Minors must be accompanied by parent/guardian. No underage drinking allowed. Proof of insurance presented with reservation. See Page 1.

12. FINAL CLOSING: The Fair will close Exhibits to visitors at 7:00 P.M. ON SUN, Oct 7, 2018.

13. SAN BENITO COUNTY 4-H PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS: Membership in the University of California San Benito County 4-H Program is open to all children in Kindergarten through 19 years of age without regard to race, religion, sex or physical handicap who reside within San Benito County school district boundaries and/or are legally in attendance at a San Benito County school. Youth residing in a county other than San Benito must have the approval of the 4-H Youth Development Advisor from their home county and the San Benito County 4-H Youth Development Advisor and the community club leader of the club he/she seeks to join. Families enrolled in a San Benito 4-H club prior to this policy being implemented, will be allowed to continue participating in the program as long as they have the approval of the 4-H Youth Development of both counties annually. **MUST BE 9 YEARS OLD OR IN THE 4th GRADE BY JAN 1, 2018 AND ENROLLED IN ALL PROJECTS BY JAN. 1, 2018 TO PARTICIPATE IN THE FAIR.**

14. FRAUDULENT ENTRIES: If after the judges have made their awards, the Association finds that an exhibitor has improperly and falsely entered any exhibit, said exhibitor will forfeit all rights to all premiums that may have been awarded him/her in all departments of the Fair.

15. CANCELLED ENTRIES: Exhibitors canceling their entries in Livestock or Horse Show for any reason after the official date for the closing of the entries, excepting written verification by a qualified veterinarian, shall forfeit their entry fees. Veterinary certificates must state the date of inspection and the nature of disqualification and must be filed in the fairgrounds office at least 24 hours prior to the start of the Fair. This rule will be rigidly enforced.

16. Leader/Advisor Signature Procedure: Due to the online entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows: after entry closing date a list of all online entries (livestock and non-livestock) for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader/FFA Advisor/Grange Leader. There will be an email for each leader/advisor asking to certify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2018 fair. This signed sheet **MUST** be emailed, faxed or postmarked by Oct 1, 2018 (no metered mail).

17. STILL EXHIBIT RULE: Attention all 4-H and FFA exhibitors entering exhibits in any MARKET class. Each 4-H & FFA Market Exhibitor is required to enter and deliver at least one entry in either the 4-H (Dept. 50) or the FFA (Dept. 51) Still Exhibits Department. All entries must have been made, collected, grown or prepared within one year of the opening date of the 2018 fair. **4-H EDUCATIONAL POSTERS AND FFA EDUCATIONAL POSTERS DO NOT SATISFY THIS RULE.** The still exhibits must be received on Sat, Sep 22 or Sun, Sep 23, 10:00 p.m. through 3:00 p.m. at the Youth Exhibits Hall. **FAILURE TO DELIVER THE REQUIRED ENTRY WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION OF ALL MARKET ENTRIES IN THIS YEARS FAIR.** Animals will be sent home. No exceptions. All other rules stated in the exhibitor handbook apply.

Message from the Governor

Matting using a windowed mat. Windowed mats can be purchased at Aaron Brothers, Michaels, Beverly's, and online. Typically, an 11x14 inch size mat will have a window for an 8x10 photo, and a 16x20 inch mat will have a window for an 11x14 inch photo.

1. Position the photo face up behind the window part of the mat.
2. Once you settle on how the photo looks through the window, tape the photo to the back of the window part of the mat.
3. Now use double-sided tape to adhere the window part to the back part of the mat or leave the back of the mat back off.
4. Be sure to label your photo on the upper left corner when facing the back of the mat.

Matting with art-board or foam core. (more difficult to get right)

1. Cut the foam core to 11x14 inches or 16x20 inches depending on your division. Use a stiff plastic or metal straight edge (T-Square or metal ruler) and sharp hobby knife or similar on a nice flat cutting board instead of a paper cutter or scissors. Watch your fingers! Try to be as neat as possible. The border of mat can be 1 to two inches on all sides.
2. Position the photo on the cut foam core or art-board, making sure that it is in the center of the board both top to bottom and left to right. Mark the edges of the photo on the foam core lightly with a lightly penciled rectangle or dots at the 4 corners of the photo.
3. Place the photo on a scrap of cardboard face down and spray the back of the photo with spray glue. You could use Elmer's non-wrinkle rubber cement/or double-sided tape. There are two types of spray glue (permanent and repositionable). If permanent, you only need to spray the back of the photo. If repositionable, spray the foam core or art board as well. To do this lightly tape paper to four sides of the foam core creating a masked window to spray the glue right where the photo will be placed. Exact alignment is important.
4. Place the photo carefully on the art board starting at one edge. Wax paper can also be used to help position the photo; then can be pulled away to allow the photo to adhere to the mat.
5. Carefully erase any pencil marks.
6. Be sure to label your photo on the upper left corner of the back.

Concerns about hanging

Velcro or special hanging hooks do not need to be attached to the back when matted. Photos on aluminum or canvas should have a method for hanging suitable for the size and weight of the photo.

Special Instructions:

Photo Art: Tape an envelope to back of photo containing 3x5s or 4x6s of original photo or photos you used before it was altered. The photos will be displayed beside the photo art piece.

Panorama Photos: Try to maintain a photo height of 6 inches or more; width can vary. Mount on art board or foam core.

Humorous: Attach 3x5 card with an optional humorous caption.

Flashback: Two photos same size side by side (early photo on left, current photo on right) or a composite of both side by side.

Movie/Video: Needs a title screen that gives the title, author, actor's names, etc. No more than two minutes in length; Mp4 Codec H264 preferred. If you don't know about formats send them anyway. Email videos to or put the video on an SD or USB stick, place in an envelope that is clearly labeled with your name, address, phone, email, division and class. HORSE SHOW: Unless other rules are specified, rules and definitions for conducting each class as contained in the rule book of USA Equestrian (formerly AHSA) will apply to this Horse Show provided they do not conflict with any of the rules and regulations prescribed by the Division of Fairs and Expositions of the California Department of Food and Agriculture.

8. OPEN TO 4-H, FFA, GRANGE MEMBERS and INDEPENDENT JUNIORS RESIDING IN SAN BENITO, SANTA CRUZ & MONTEREY COUNTIES. MERCED COUNTY OPEN TO JUNIOR DAIRY CATTLE ONLY. ALL JUNIOR DEPARTMENT RULES & INSTRUCTIONS APPLY.

Livestock Local Rules

1. BILL OF SALE MUST BE MADE OUT TO INDIVIDUAL EXHIBITOR FOR BEEF ENTRIES ONLY.

2. LOSS OF EAR TAG: In case of lost ear tag exhibitor must notify Fair management within 24 hours. Species Chairperson will be notified, and arrangements made to retag animal.

3. NO PAINT ON HOGS, GLITTER ON STEERS, writing of any kind on any animal will result in forfeiture of awards and or monies.

4. WEIGHING OF LIVESTOCK: All market livestock (beef, goats, lambs and swine) will be IN PLACE by 3:30 p.m. Weigh in will be Tue, Oct 2, 2018 from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. Livestock not in place by 3:30 p.m. will be last to weigh in. NO EXCEPTIONS. Animals will not be weighed off trailer!! EXHIBITOR MUST BE PRESENT WHEN THEIR ANIMAL IS WEIGHED IN. For market animals, see Junior Livestock Auction Rules

5. STALLS AND PENS MUST BE NEATLY KEPT and supplied with necessary clean bedding. Pathways approaches and aisles between barns MUST be kept clean for the convenience of spectators. This work must be completed by 7:30 a.m. each day. NO EXCEPTIONS.

6. RECEIVING TIME for JUNIOR BREEDING ANIMALS is Tue, Oct 2, 2018 for swine, sheep, dairy goats and commercial meat does, beef, and dairy cattle by 7:00 PM.

7. ENTRIES RELEASED ON SUN, Oct 7, 2018 AT 7:00 P.M. TACK MAY BE WALKED OUT ON SUN. BETWEEN 7:00 A.M. AND 9:00 A.M. AND BETWEEN 4:00 P.M. AND 5:00 P.M. TACK MAY BE DRIVEN OUT BETWEEN 5:00 P.M. AND 6:00 P.M. ON SUN. EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS AND DECORATIONS MUST STAY IN PLACE UNTIL 4:00 P.M.

8. BREEDING ANIMALS (beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep and goats) in the Junior Divisions are open to Monterey, San Benito and Santa Cruz County residents, on a LIMITED SPACE AVAILABLE BASIS.

9. SAN BENITO COUNTY MARKET EXHIBITORS will be limited to: TWO (2) animals per below:

- If selling a Beef, may also sell 1 Goat or 1 Lamb or 1 small animal.
- If selling a Hog, may also sell 1 small animal.
- If selling a Lamb, may also sell 1 small animal.
- If selling a Goat, may also sell 1 small animal.
- If selling only small animals, may sell 2 small animals.

Small Animal is defined as rabbit meat pen, turkey and poultry meat pen that places in the top 5.

10. SANTA CRUZ AND MONTEREY COUNTY MARKET EXHIBITORS are limited to ONE (1) entry per exhibitor. MARKET BEEF, GOATS, SHEEP, SWINE, TURKEY, POULTRY MEAT PEN AND RABBIT MEAT PEN.

11. NO MORE THAN ONE OWNERSHIP ON EACH ENTRY FORM. Livestock must be solely owned by and under exhibitor's care and management. Project must be under supervision of an organization to be eligible to show. Exception - horses and dairy cattle can be leased.

12. PROTEST – refer to State Rule V, rules 1 through 15. Decision of Livestock Superintendent cannot be protested and is final. All protests must be presented to the management of the Fair within 24 hours of the alleged violation, or 24 hours after the results are available to the public of exhibits judged pre-fair. Protest must be accompanied by a \$100 deposit (cash, money order or certified check) which will be returned only if the protest is determined valid. Protest and appropriate action are decided by the Fair's Board of Directors or designees in a timely manner.

13. AN EXHIBITOR WILL BE DISQUALIFIED from his/her class, if he/she fails to be present and ready to perform within three (3) minutes from the time his/her class or number is called.

14. CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION for all market species

will return for Overall Grand Champion. Doesn't include Rabbits and Poultry.

15. BEDDING STRAW may be used for Dairy Cattle Only. **SHAVINGS ONLY** for all other livestock. **NO BEDDING WILL BE FURNISHED BY THE FAIR.**

16. **NO HANDS-ON POLICY** (All Junior Livestock Exhibitors): All projects must be under the exhibitor's care and management. Junior exhibitors (the owner of the exhibit) are required to groom their own animals, however they may be assisted in grooming, clipping or blocking by another junior livestock exhibitor of the San Benito County Fair. Anyone who is determined by management to require help from an adult, shall be granted such, in writing prior to the Fair. The use of professional groomers will be cause for disqualification of the exhibitor and/or animal. Disqualification consists of the withholding of premium money and ribbons, elimination from further competition and/or removal from the auction.

17. LIVESTOCK SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS: The member fairs of the Western Fairs Association are uniting to support ethical and humane treatment of all animals exhibited at our fairs and expositions, as well as reinforcing the educational emphasis of competitive programs for animals and maintaining the highest integrity standard of all participants. Henceforth, the member fairs of the Western Fairs Association have adopted drafts of the National Show Ring Code of Ethics as proposed by the American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association in Jun. 1995 and the Code for Show Ring Ethics drafted by the International Association of Fairs and Expositions as working guidelines for member fairs. The Show Ring code of ethics expresses the belief that we should exhibit animals on their own merits and each animal should be handled properly with attention towards its needs.

18. ANIMAL OWNERSHIP: 120 consecutive days for Beef (on or before May 28, 2018). 60 consecutive days for swine, sheep and goats (on or before Jul 28, 2018).

19. See LOCAL RULES & REGULATIONS, Page 7, concerning the required Still Exhibit. Failure to comply will result in DISQUALIFICATION of all Market Entries for an exhibitor.

20. PARKING: All vehicles and trailers must be parked in designated areas. Vehicles parked in other areas of the fairgrounds will be towed away at the owner's expense.

21. Award recipient Thank You letters are due to the Awards Chair, Jiana Escobar, Sun, Oct 7 between 12pm and 2pm in the main arena. Envelope must be addressed, stamped and unsealed. Please write the name of the award on the upper left-hand corner of envelope.

22. WATER CONSERVATION RULES: All hoses at wash racks will be required to use a shut-off nozzle. Non-use of nozzle will ban member from washing animal on the fairgrounds. **NO WASHING OF ANIMALS AFTER 3:00 P.M. ON FRI. OR ANYTIME ON SAT. OR SUN.** In addition, an exhibitor may be subject to a \$50.00 fine for non-compliance. The San Benito County Fair appreciates your assistance in conserving water. Thank you.

23. PARTNER FOR A SAFE FAIR: The goal of the Fair Board is to present a fair that is not only fun, but safe for exhibitors and other guests. We ask that all fair livestock exhibitors and their families observe safe practices in the barns. This year, thanks to the partnership of our youth, we will debut new livestock pens. For the protection of our exhibitors and the preservation of the pens, there is to be no climbing on the bars of the pens. Only proper electrical outlets should be used with no overloading or hazardous placement of cords. Reducing the risk of food contamination is critical. Observing the 'no food or beverage' policy in the barns is important. New signage will be posted to remind both exhibitors and fair guests that food consumption is prohibited in barns. Additionally, signage will stress the policy of guests not touching livestock. Hand washing is an essential protective practice for our exhibitors and guests alike. New postings will also be placed in and around the barns and hand washing stations. We thank our livestock exhibitors for their partnership in reducing potential risks.

24. A \$5.00 Security Fee is included in the Entry Fee for large animals.

Junior Livestock Special Rules

SPECIAL 4-H CLUB Rules and Regulations:

1. All eligibility and age limitations as per county 4-H participation Requirements (See Local Rules).
2. The 4-H show uniform to be worn by all 4-H exhibitors and by helpers in individual and club groups while showing at the horse show and livestock shows shall consist of: 4-H cap (must be worn on head or be visible tucked in belt loop or pocket), white shirt or blouse (short or long sleeve). Absolutely no midribs or sleeveless shirts are to be worn. Pants may be white or black (no acid wash) must be long enough to cover the ankles. If pants have belt loops, belt must be worn.

SPECIAL FFA CHAPTER RULES:

1. The official FFA Show Uniform to be worn by all FFA exhibitors and by helpers in individual and chapter groups while showing at fairs and livestock shows shall consist of white trousers, white dress shirt (short or long sleeves) with FFA emblem attached to the left pocket and the official FFA four-in-hand necktie. The official FFA jacket is optional; if worn, the shirt emblem is not required. Hats or headgear (except if showing in light horse classes) of any kind shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing.
2. Students competing in this division must be regularly enrolled in the high school vocational agriculture program and must meet the requirements, rules and regulations set up by the C.A.T.A. and the State Association of FFA.
3. All entries in this division must be from projects carried as a part of the regular high school agricultural program and must be owned by the student.

SPECIAL INDEPENDENT & GRANGE JUNIOR EXHIBITOR RULES:

1. Exhibitors not affiliated with any organization can enter appropriate FFA or 4-H classes, if they meet the following requirements: Independent exhibitors must be at least 9 years old or in the 4th Grade by Jan. 1, 2018. Exhibitors are eligible to compete/exhibit through Dec. 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.
2. Independent Juniors must not have been in a junior organization within one (1) year of the Fair to be eligible to participate.
3. Dress code for Independent Juniors for showing livestock:
 - a. White or solid black jeans – No acid wash
 - b. White shirt, long or short sleeves
 - c. Belt
 - d. Clean & polished boots or shoes – No pant legs tucked in boots
 - e. ABSOLUTELY NO MIDRIFTS OR SLEEVELESS SHIRTS.

FAILURE TO FOLLOW RULES BELOW WILL RESULT IN FORFEITURE OF AWARDS AND/OR MONIES.

Rules and Regulations:

1. **Leader/Advisor Signature Procedure:** Due to the online entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows: after entry closing date a list of all entries (livestock and non-livestock) for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader/FFA Advisor/Grange Leader. There will be a one-page sheet for each leader/advisor to certify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2018 fair. This signed sheet **MUST** be mailed, faxed or mailed back to the fair by Oct 1, 2018.
2. **EAR TAG NUMBER(S) MUST BE LISTED CORRECTLY ON ENTRY FORM.** Animal will not be permitted to enter the Fair if ear tag number does not match entry form. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
3. **ALL LIVESTOCK MUST ARRIVE CLEAN AND IN SHOW CONDITION.**
4. All sheep and goats **MUST** have a scrapie tag to show.
5. **Certificate of Drug Medication MUST be filled out, properly signed and turned in at Receiving.**
6. **If a market animal is considered not market ready by the judge, then the animal is not eligible for sale.**
7. The exhibitor of any animal considered wild by the livestock committee will be asked to remove the animal from the fair.
8. All animals must be able to be led by the exhibitor while at the fair.
9. Release time of livestock on Sun, Oct 7, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. or at a time designated by the Livestock Department. Any livestock leaving prior to release time may result in forfeiture of all awards and monies. Exhibitor will not be allowed to show at future San Benito County Fairs.
10. **ALL EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR CLEANING, FEEDING AND WATERING THEIR LIVESTOCK UNTIL RELEASE ON SUN, Oct 7, 2018.** Exhibitors not feeding or watering animals on Sun. will forfeit all award and auction monies.
11. All market animals must be pre-tagged on specified dates. Parent & Exhibitor must be present day of tagging. In the event exhibitor and parent cannot be present, a leader or designated representative may fill in providing this change is approved by Fair management in writing two weeks prior to the tagging date. **Pre-tagging of an animal is NOT an automatic entry in the San Benito County Fair.** Exhibitors must enter pre-tagged animals and pay all fees by the entry deadline to be eligible to participate in the fair (see page 1).
12. Three (3) entries will constitute a minimum class. Where entries are less than for a minimum class at the close of entry, the class may be cancelled or combined. This decision will be made by management and department chairs.
13. Animals not sold through the auction **MUST** be removed from fairgrounds at exhibitor's expense on Sun, Oct 7, 2018.
14. **No practice roping in livestock area.**

POSTMORTEM EXAMINATIONS

The San Benito County Fair reserves the right to perform a postmortem examination of any animal which dies at the San Benito County Fair. If required, this must be performed by an official veterinarian at the expense of the exhibitor.

American System of Judging

Pre-entry required.

Rules & Regulations:

1. **All 4-H and FFA market & livestock animal exhibitors in goat, sheep, swine & cattle divisions are required to enter livestock showmanship.** Exhibitor must show their own market animal if they are exhibiting a market animal. Exhibitor can only show a breeding animal if this is the only animal they are exhibiting.

2. All 4-H and FFA Horse Show exhibitors are required to enter Horse Showmanship. Please see Dept 64 for more rules.

2. Exhibitors shall be on hand and ready to exhibit at the time called for judging. After one call if exhibitor is not present then he/she will be dismissed from the class. No exceptions.

3. Exhibitors may compete in only one class for each species of livestock.

4. First and second-class winners of 4-H Novice, 4-H Junior and FFA Novice are eligible to advance to the next level of showmanship.

5. All exhibitors are required to wear the show uniform of the organization they represent. (Girls may wear slacks instead of skirts.) See uniform regulations under Junior Livestock Special Rules.

6. Only animals owned, fitted and shown by the exhibitor in the Junior Department Livestock divisions are eligible. Horses in the Horse Show are also eligible. Bulls, stallions, rams, boars and Billy goats are not eligible for showmanship.

7. Rabbit Showmanship participants must wear long sleeve shirts or blouses.

8. Age based on age as of Jan. 1, 2018.

9. Definitions:

4-H PRIMARY: Open to 4-H member from 5 years old to 9 years old and can show in the class every year until they become official 4-H age of 9 years old and in the 4th grade.

4-H NOVICE: Open to 4-H members 9 years old through 10 years old who have never shown this species of animal at any fair. Note: First and second place winners may advance to 4-H Junior Showmanship. Any member who has shown in Novice Showmanship at any fair will advance to Junior Showmanship.

4-H JUNIOR: Open to 4-H members 11 years old through 13 years old regardless of experience and number of years in 4-H, and 9 through 10-year olds who have already shown in Novice Showmanship at any fair. First and second place winners may advance to 4-H Senior Showmanship.

4-H SENIOR: Open to any 4-H member 14 years old through 19 years of age regardless of the number of years in 4-H.

FFA NOVICE: Exhibitors showing this species for the first time and that have never shown this species previously in this or any other organization. Note: First and second place winners may advance to FFA Advanced Showmanship.

FFA ADVANCED: Open to any FFA member regardless of the number of years showing.

1. The San Benito County Fair, to encourage the boys and girls of San Benito, Monterey and Santa Cruz Counties in their livestock feed projects, will hold a terminal auction sale of market livestock starting at 9:00 A.M. Sat, Oct 6, 2018.

2. All beef, sheep, swine and market goats that are market ready will be sold at auction. Overall Champion & Reserve Champion, Third, Fourth and Fifth place meat pens of rabbits & poultry and turkeys, if market ready, will be sold.

3. When an entry is made in the market divisions, it is automatically assigned to the San Benito County Fair Junior Livestock Auction. This pertains to market ready animals only.

4. EXHIBITORS AND THEIR INSTRUCTORS OR LEADERS MUST BE PRESENT AT THE TIME OF THE SALE. If owner is not present, the animal will not be sold in auction, but it will be sold at market price established for resale animals. Owner must be in official uniform per Junior Livestock Special Rules.

STANDARD BRED POULTRY

Rules and Regulations:

1. Rules, definitions and judging procedures as prescribed in the latest edition of the Official Show Rules and the Standard of Perfection of the American Poultry Association, Inc. shall apply to all district and county fair poultry shows, except in such instances where they conflict with the rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture.

2. The exhibitor will be responsible for feeding, watering and cleaning their pens for the duration of the Fair.

3. Birds will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only. If no class is offered, no awards may be made. Disqualified birds and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibitors in the class.

4. A judge may excuse a bird from competition if it appears to be fatigued or out of condition, but the bird shall be counted as an entry.

5. For all classes of Standard Bred chickens, ducks, geese and turkeys, all birds must be identified by leg bands with a number and conforming to the entry form on arrival at the show.

6. Birds with wing feathers or any other feathers that have been clipped or trimmed will be disqualified.

7. It is not mandatory that a first-place award be given if there is no entry in the class or division worthy of such placing.

8. All birds are entered at the owner's risk. The Fairgrounds and its management are not responsible for any thefts or injuries that may occur to the birds.

9. **NOTE: After entries are closed, they will be screened down to the number the Fair can provide housing for.**

10. Disqualifications: A) Any animal exhibiting vicious or uncontrollable aggression which endangers the safety of the judge or the public. B) Any dying, plucking, trimming or clipping to alter appearance.

The San Benito County Cattlemen's Association has donated awards of \$200.00 for 1st place, \$100.00 for 2nd place and \$50.00 for 3rd place. Other award money will be divided and paid to 4th through 10th place.

1. All market beef are entered in the Carcass Contest. No live pickups.

2. All animals entered in the Carcass Contest must be shown in the market beef classes of the exhibitor's respective division. 4-H and FFA will be judged together.

9. The Carcass Evaluations /Awards Presentation will be held on November 14th at 6:00 p.m. in the Oak room.

10. The Carcass Contest will include a "Rate of Gain." Rate of Gain will be calculated by using the following formula. All Rate of Gain Steers will be weighed at the same time. Fair scale weight minus starting weight (at weigh-in & tag) divided by the number of days on feed equals average weight gain. Rate of gain will be ranked by the animal that highest average daily gain to the lowest.
