Departmental Rules and Regulations:

1. The feature exhibit booth provides members an opportunity to acquaint the public with a specific phase of their chapter program. The booth can show what they have learned, the activities in which they have participated or the contributions of their organization to the community. Judges will insist upon a high quality of products and materials used in the exhibit.

2. Feature Exhibit Booths shall be limited to one entry by a chapter. A high scoring exhibit will be artistically arranged, colorful, attractive and well lighted.

3. Booths must be designed, constructed and installed by organization members. The Chapter President, Vice-President or Secretary must sign the entry form.

4. Exhibitors must plan to replace all fruits and vegetables that deteriorate during the Fair.

**FFA FOOD & NUTRITION**

Rules and Regulations:

**1. Entry must specify type of foods** by name (i.e. Bar Cookie, Drop Cookie, etc.).

**2. FOOD THAT NEEDS REFRIGERATION MAY BE ENTERED.**

**3. Deliver each exhibit displayed on a disposable plate in a plastic bag.** A zippered bag is preferred. Deliver one plate for display and one for tasting (including Recipe in a Jar)

**4. Minimum quantities:**

Muffins, Biscuits, Rolls, Cookies and Candies - 4 each.

Cakes - 1/4 cake plus one slice.

Breads - half loaf plus one slice.

Pies - one standard 6" or larger.

**5. Identify with a note if baked goods are cooked in a way other than conventional, (i.e. microwave, low salt, fat or sugar free, low cholesterol).**

**6. For Decorated Cakes Only: A Styrofoam or cardboard form MUST be used provided the shape is one which could be reasonably achieved through baking. NO REAL CAKES. Royal icing is recommended.**

**7. No food will be returned.**

**FFA FOOD PRESERVATION**

Rules and Regulations:

**1. Entry must list type of product**

2. All food preservation, packaging, and labeling must list the method of process used. Low acid foods must be canned under pressure. Dried products should be wrapped in clear plastic or sealed jars. New screw rings must be used. Jar labels should list type of product and process. Label with Canning date on bottom of jar.

3. Each entry to consist of two jars - 1 jar to be judged and other jar for display of fruits, tomatoes, juices, vegetables, jellies, jams, pickles, etc.; jerky - six strips, and dried fruit - six to eight sections.

4. **Jam:** May contain crushed, uniformly chopped or very small fruit or pulp depending on the kind of jam. **Jelly:** Natural for fruit. Bright, not faded or discolored. Free from sediment, cloudiness, crystals, or fruit or foreign particles. Anything with vinegar solution is a pickled fruit or vegetable.

5. No paraffin.

6. Open "Judged" canned goods MUST be picked up on Tue, Oct 1, 2019 from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m.

7. Gift packs must be done by exhibitor consisting of homemade jams, jellies or other homemade preserved items. May include other items to carry out the theme of the gift pack

Rules and Regulations:

**1. Each entry to be listed separately and identified by name.** An exhibit may consist of an item judged individually or a coordinated exhibit consisting of from three to five items not entered elsewhere. Emphasis to be on the coordination of colors, textures, patterns and shapes.

2. Items in this division are NON-WEARABLE or not an article of clothing. There may be knitted or crocheted, machine stitched, hand stitched, quilted, refinished, framed, drawn or woven, etc.

3. All pictures and plaques must be equipped for hanging.

1. If a member is entering an item that is pre-cut or pre-stamped, the member must attach a note stating which portion of the item completed. Members should select articles to do within their ability and will be judged on the neatness and artistry of the exhibit.

2. Hand stamped leather craft items will be judged separately from hand tooled items.

3. Artwork should be mounted on foam board or a mat and ready to display.

Display cards must be filled out and attached to each exhibit in this department, correctly labeling the exhibit and giving a summary of the student exhibitor's project.

**FFA EDUCATIONAL POSTERS**

Rules and Regulations:

1. See **LOCAL RULES & REGULATIONS, Page 7, concerning the required Still Exhibit. Failure to comply will result in DISQUALIFICATION of all Market Entries for an exhibitor. 4-H EDUCATIONAL POSTERS DO NOT SATISFY THE STILL EXHIBIT RULE**
2. Posters or Trifold.
3. No advertising allowed.
4. Livestock educational posters informs the public about Beef, Dairy, Goats, Sheep or Swine. Subject material limited to animal husbandry, health, feeds, breeding and breed types. They are to be displayed in the barn area after judging.
5. Poultry & Rabbit educational posters inform the public about Poultry or Rabbits. Subject material limited to animal husbandry, health, feeds, breeding and breed types. They are to be displayed in the Poultry Building after judging.

**FFA PHOTOGRAPHY**

Rules and Regulations:

1. **Limit: two entries per exhibitor per class.**
2. Needs to be display ready.
3. Deliver entries to the Youth Exhibits Hall.
4. Photo size must be 4 x 6 or 5 x 7.
5. **Matting and Mounting Instructions - All photo entries must be secured on a mount board, foam core or in a mat using glue, mounting tissue, spray or tape with a 1 to 2-inch border around the photo. Only one photo on one mount board or matting per entry. Warning: Photos mounted (adhered) on foam core may come loose and be damaged. FYI: Mount Board and Matting can be purchased at any craft or hobby store. (i.e.: Michael's, Target, Stationary Stores or Frame Shops). Mounted photographs on mount board require a 1 to 2-inch border around the photo - no hole for the photograph. Matted photographs require a 1 to 2-inch border around the photo - mats have a hole for the photograph. If there is mount board behind the matt, securely bond both pieces together.**
6. **No frames of any kind with glass.**
7. Label the back of each photo with exhibitor name, division and class.
