Rules and Regulations:

**1. MINIMUM WEIGHT FOR MARKET GOATS IS 65 POUNDS. ANIMALS WEIGHING OVER THE MAXIMUM WEIGHT OF 105 POUNDS WILL ONLY BE PAID TO 105 POUNDS.**

**2. WEIGH-IN: ALL MARKET GOATS MUST BE WEIGHED between 3:00 and 7:00 P.M. Tue, Oct 1, 2019.**

**3. Market animals must be clipped and bathed and arrive in show condition.**

**4. After weighing, market goats may be divided into weight lots desired by management for convenience in judging.**

**5. No force feeding or watering.**

**6. No artificial coloring of body of animal will be allowed. Hooves are OK. Infraction of this rule will result in disqualification.**

**7. Wethers and does, any breed or crossbred goat less than 12 months of age showing milk teeth. All breeds judged together. Goats must be dehorned. Scurs will be allowed up to one half inch.**

**8. ANIMAL OWNERSHIP – See Livestock Local Rule #18 on Page 61.**

**9. ALL GOATS MUST HAVE SCRAPIE TAGS.**

**DIVISION 115 SAN BENITO COUNTY BREEDER'S SHOWCASE**

**Entry Fees: (per entry per class) \$10.00**

Rules and Regulations:

1. Must be entered and shown in market, breeding or feeder class.

2. Goat must be bred and kidded in San Benito County. They must be raised by local meat goat producer prior to exhibitor purchase.

3. Bill of Sale must be from San Benito County Breeder.

4. Each goat owned by exhibitor must have individual entry.

5. Must enter breeder's name on entry form.

6. All State and Local Rules apply.

7. After judging of appropriate market classes, goats entered will be judged together and placing will be by section of judge.

Class:

1. San Benito County Breeder's Showcase Market Goat.

**COMMERCIAL & PUREBRED MEAT GOAT BREEDING SHOW**

This Class consists of any doe which is used to produce meat, quality kids. This will be the mainly purebred Boer goats and Boer x Does, but could also include does of other meat breeds. (NO DAIRY GOATS). To be judged aftermarket goats. All purebred stock must be registered in the herd book of a recognized association. Recognized associations include: International Boer Goat Association, American Boer Goat Association and the Canadian Boer Goat Association. Registration papers must be checked by the show management upon check-in. All goats must have legible tattoos consistent with the registration certificate or the animal will be disqualified due to illegible or inconsistent tattoos. All goats must have a scrapie tag in place.

Management reserves the right to add, delete, combine or change classes to benefit the show.

Goats shown in the Market Show are not eligible for the Breeding Show.

The purpose of this contest is to provide added incentive for the students to continually strive to raise better quality market goats that will meet industry standards. This contest will provide the student with a carcass evaluation only.

NOTE: THERE WILL BE NO ENTRY FOR THIS CONTEST. 4-H AND FFA GOATS WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY ENTERED

***A Buckle as well as prize money for 1<sup>st</sup> place.***

1. All market goats are entered in the Carcass Contest. No live pickups.
2. All animals entered in the Carcass Contest must be shown in the market goat classes of the exhibitor's respective division. 4-H and FFA will be judged together.
3. The animals will be sold in the Junior Livestock Auction.
4. Entry in the Carcass Contest will be automatic for all animals sold through the Junior Livestock Auction.
5. All animals entered in this contest will be consigned to a packing house designated by the Fair.
6. Carcasses will be graded at the packing house by USDA graders and results compiled by department chairs assisted by Hollister FFA Department. Leaders will present results, there will be NO LIVE RESULTS given
7. All carcasses must grade USDA Top Select or higher to be eligible for cash awards. Results will be calculated for all market goats entered.
8. Placing will be based on grid placing; ties will be broken by yield grade and quality grade.
