American System of Judging

Rules and Regulations:

1. Lambs and Sheep arriving at the Fair will be inspected at a designated check point prior to weigh-in. Lambs will be thoroughly checked for fungus and any health related problems. Lambs with health issues will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately.

2. Muzzling of any animal is prohibited.

3. All animals and breeding lambs must be docked such that the tail (dock) can be lifted. Lambs that have been re-docked or have complete tail removal will not be eligible.

Additional Rules and Regulations:

1. Flock numbers shall be used to identify all entries. Numbers shall be on regular and practical tags attached to the ear or tattooed in the ear.

2. An exhibitor may not use the same flock number on more than one animal during any two consecutive calendar years.

3. Registration numbers may not be used in flock numbers. Flock numbers and breeder's initials, name or association prefix shall be on regular and practical tags attached to the ear or tattooed in the ear for yearlings and lambs bred by the exhibitor.

4. Lambs must show lambs teeth.

5. Market animals are not eligible for breeding show.

Sheep Carcass Contest Rules

The purpose of this contest is to provide added incentive for the students to continually strive to raise better quality market sheep that will meet industry standards. This contest will provide the student with a carcass evaluation only.

NOTE: THERE WILL BE NO ENTRY FOR THIS CONTEST. 4-H AND FFA SHEEP WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY ENTERED

A Buckle as well as prize money for 1st place.

1. All market sheep are entered in the Carcass Contest. No live pickups.

2. All animals entered in the Carcass Contest must be shown in the market sheep classes of the exhibitor's respective division. 4-H and FFA will be judged together.

3. The animals will be sold in the Junior Livestock Auction.

4. Entry in the Carcass Contest will be automatic for all animals sold through the Junior Livestock Auction.

5. All animals entered in this contest will be consigned to a packing house designated by the Fair.

6. Carcasses will be graded at the packing house by USDA graders and results compiled by department chairs assisted by Hollister FFA Department. Leaders will present results, there will be **NO LIVE RESULTS** given.

7. All carcasses must grade USDA Top Select or higher to be eligible for cash awards. Results will be calculated for all market sheep entered.

8. Placing will be based on grid placing; ties will be broken by yield grade and quality grade.
