

Dept. 80 - Round Robin

Rules and Regulations:

1. Showmanship class winners of 4-H Intermediate, 4-H Senior and FFA Advanced Showmanship in each livestock division (Market Goats, Dairy Goats, Sheep, Swine, Beef, Dairy Cattle, Horses, Rabbits & Poultry) have the opportunity to show in the Round Robin Class in which they won.
2. Exhibitors, who should win more than one species of Showmanship, must designate the species they will represent during Round Robin **no later than Friday night at 5pm in the Fair entry office**. They will need to notify the species Chair at that time. The second-place winner of a class NOT CHOSEN BY THE WINNER will then be eligible to compete. If the second-place winner chooses not to show, we will contact the following placings in order until a designated delegate for that species is secured to ensure a full class for Round Robin.
3. If an exhibitor wins both Intermediate and Advanced Showmanship for the same species, they have the option to pick which Round Robin class to participate in. The next placed exhibitor in the class not chosen will have the opportunity to participate until the delegate for the class is secured.
4. Animals to be shown for Round Robin will be chosen by the species Chair.
5. Exhibitors will be assigned numbers for animals to be shown.
6. State Fair Large Animal Master Showmanship – Only exhibitors winning Advanced level Round Robin in livestock competition at their County or District Fair between Aug. 4, 2018 and Aug. 3, 2019 are eligible to compete. Fairs occurring after Aug. 3, 2019 shall be eligible for entry in the **2020** California State Fair Master Showmanship competition.
7. If a defect or injury is found by exhibitor on animal it must be mentioned to judge or Chair.
8. Species shown will be Market Goats, Dairy Goats, Sheep, Swine, Beef & Dairy Cattle. No Horses, Rabbits or Poultry will be shown in the Round Robin competition; however, the winners of those species are still eligible to compete. **If there are not enough animals of a species to complete a round, then that species will be eliminated from the Round Robin competition. The showmanship winner of that species is still eligible to compete in Round Robin.**
9. If an exhibitor chooses not to show a species for any reason, that person can sit out of the class and receive the highest score relative to the number of exhibitors in the class. For example, nine exhibitors = 9 score for that species not shown.
10. Judge's decision will be final.
11. It will be at the Judges' discretion to have an animal removed if they deem necessary for any reason.
12. In the event of a tie score, the exhibitor who won the most classes for the species shown will be placed first for the competition.
