Local Rules and Regulations

1. Exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with these rules and to abide by them. All departments in the 2020 San Benito County Fair are open to residents and producers of the 33rd District Agricultural Association (San Benito County). In case of non-residents, producers means bona fide property owners in San Benito County during 2020, the status of which will be determined by the management of the Association through inspection of the county tax records. Also, producers must regularly grow or raise the produce exhibited in San Benito County; if not, their land must be part of that owned or operated in San Benito County. All decisions will be final. **Some departments have opened their entries to a wider area. Please check each department to see if other counties are eligible.**

2. **CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES:** All Virtual Stills Exhibit Show photos must be received to the department email address by Midnight on Friday September 11, 2020.

3. **JUDGING OF EXHIBITS:** Will be determined in each department. Please read the details in the department(s) you wish to participate in.

4. **PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS:** There will be no entry fees and there will be no premiums or awards paid.

5. **REJECTION OF EXHIBITS:** The Association reserves the right to reject any exhibit that is not photographed well, to dark or too light. That includes items in the photo that are not G-rated and family friendly. That are copyrighted photos appearing to be someone else's work.

6. **FRAUDULENT ENTRIES:** Please only photograph and submit your own work.

7. **CANCELLED ENTRIES:** You may change your mind and ask for your photo to be removed any time before it is uploaded.

8. **STILL EXHIBIT REMINDER: THE PHOTOS OF YOUR EXHIBIT WILL BE POSTED ON SOCIAL MEDIA AND OUR WEB SITE. PLEASE DO NOT SHARE ANYTHING WITH US THAT YOU DO NOT WANT OUT ON A PUBLIC WEB ENVIRONMENT. We are planning a Drive-Through Food and Fair on October 2 through 4, 2020. For these days we plan to enhance our food offerings, including a Farmers Market option and line the route cars travel with various items of visual entertainment. We plan to have Farm Machinery, Pull Trucks, Barnyard buddies animals, Agriculture Education posters and various other ideas are coming together. We will also use our livestock panels to create a space for our sponsor banners, educational information and members of the community to display their information.

All panels and booths displays must be completely assembled by the exhibitor and to be done by Friday, October 2nd at 12:00 pm. Materials must be able to outside in the sun and foggy nights for 3 days. Display items must be picked up Sunday, October 4th between 7:00 and 8:00 pm or Monday, October 5th between 8:00 am and 12:00 pm. All materials left behind after that time will be considered abandoned and disposed of. Use your imagination and help us celebrate our community and your business, organizations or event!

We would like to include you and have several different ways for you to consider.

Display Panels: Exhibit may be 1 dimensional attached to a metal livestock type panel. Each whole Panel is 6' tall and 12' wide. There are 6 horizontal bars and one vertical bar in the middle. We are offering space for you to create and hang your banner, poster or other informational or educational material. Items may be hung on the rails using zip ties, twine or light gage wire. Please do not use tape it will not hold well in the weather and may peel the paint. Painters tape may be used if needed. The community will have the opportunity to read as they pass by and wait in line for their Fair food treats.

Feature Booth: Exhibit may be 3 dimensional and contained within the self-provided 10'x10' pop up canopy. Items in the canopy must be visible for the guests sitting in their cars. These are static booths; we are not able to allow people on site to staff them.

Brochures, Flyers or Give Away: Business cards, post cards, pens, pencils or any family friendly give away item advertising your business, campaign, etc. will be collected in the Fair office any time after receipt of this letter and until Wednesday September 16th at 4:00pm. Items will be safely placed into a 12" x 18" plastic 'goodie bag' and will be passed out to each car that enters our Drive through experience. We would like to plan to assemble 500 bags to distribute. Free community support.

Commercial, Government Agency and Political \$75: Use a whole 6'x12' panel to hang a self-produced poster, banner or educational material on a panel to be viewed from the car window. Or use a 10' x 10' pop up you provide to create a display. Must be able to stay up outside and will not be secured or returned unless the individual comes to pick it up.

Community Organization \$0: 4-H, Girl Scouts, Service clubs, etc. may decorate a panel to share information about their organization. Donations are welcome but not required. Or a 10' x 10' pop up you provide can be used to create a display. Must be able to stay up outside and will not be secured or returned unless the individual comes to pick it up.
