How to Enter the Fair

1. Visit <http://sanbenito.fairwire.com> for the SBCF online entries home page, entries open August 17, 2022.
2. Livestock Exhibitors MUST have your YQCA Certificates complete and ready to upload.
3. Register as a “new” exhibitor. Complete the steps required for your personal information.
4. Click “Add Entry” and choose a “Department”.
5. Within each department you will be asked to choose a “Class” and information pertaining to your entry
 - a. Please answer each question accurately
 - b. You may add additional information such as a Title or a Description about your item
 - c. Continue to add additional entries
 - d. Pay special attention to filling out your entries. Be sure that your name, address and city are clear on each section. Whenever signatures on affidavits are necessary, be sure they are supplied. Check your department, division and class numbers carefully with the Exhibitor Handbook prior to entering. Wrong department, division or class numbers appearing can lead to disqualification if not corrected in time. When in doubt, please don’t hesitate to check with the Fair entry office during business hours 831-628-3421 or email anytime entry@sanbenitocountyfair.com.
6. When entries are complete, follow the prompts to complete your shopping cart and pay for your entries
 - a. Remember! You must click “Save Cart” in order for your account to be saved
 - b. After “saving your cart” you may come back to pay at a later date (but don’t forget!)
 - c. Any “carts” not paid for by September 8th, 2022 at 11:59 p.m. will not be accepted!
NO EXCEPTIONS!!
 - d. Entry Office will be available until 6:00 p.m. on September 8th, 2022 and available on Friday, September 9th until 10:00 a.m. to answer any questions. Don’t wait until the last minute, as there will be a \$25.00 charge for this assistance.
7. Depending on your division entered, you may be prompted to upload a photo or documents, for example;
 - a. Photo of the item
 - b. Presentation of Demonstration videos must be email to entry@sanbenitocountyfair.com by September 8th, 2022.
8. Print out your receipt! This is your proof that you did indeed make the entry deadline

10. TEACHERS!! For the Arts & Crafts entries, you may fill out a written entry form and deliver it to the SBCF, complete with payment, instead of using the online process. Teacher Entry Forms will be found online.

California Fairs State Rules

Local Rules and Regulations

1. Exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with these rules and to abide by them. All departments in the 2022 San Benito County Fair are open to residents and producers of the 33rd District Agricultural Association (San Benito County). In case of non-residents, producer's means bona fide property owners in San Benito County during 2022, the status of which will be determined by the management of the Association through inspection of the county tax records. Also, producers must regularly grow or raise the produce exhibited in San Benito County; if not, their land must be part of that owned or operated in San Benito County. All decisions will be final. Some departments have opened their entries to a wider area. Please check each department to see if other counties are eligible.

2. **CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES:** September 8th, 2022. **NO refunds will be made.** On-line entries accepted until midnight of September 8th, 2022.

3. **JUDGING OF EXHIBITS:** Will occur between Friday, September 24th and Sunday, October 2nd, 2022. See judging schedule on pages 7 & 8 and in individual departments. American System of Judging: each work judged in competition with other entries in its class unless otherwise stated. Danish System of Judging: based upon established standards of quality for each type of product; each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets that standard rather than how it compares with other exhibits.

4. **DAMAGE TO STOCK:** The Board of Directors will use every precaution in their power for the safe preservation of all articles and stock on exhibition, but will not be accountable for loss or damage, whatever may be the cause or the extent of damage done. Exhibitors must give attention to their articles or animals during the Fair and at the close of the exhibition.

5. **PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS:** Checks will be issued for premiums as soon as possible after the close of the Fair.

6. **UNDELIVERED PREMIUMS FORFEITED:** All premiums awarded by the Association will be mailed to the address given on entry form. Undeliverable premiums will be forfeited to the State of California.

7. **UNCLAIMED AWARDS:** After 30 days, any unclaimed exhibits or awards become the property of the 33rd District Agricultural Association and may be disposed of.

8. **REJECTION OF EXHIBITS:** The Association reserves the right to reject any exhibit improperly entered, or when the ownership is in doubt, or if required entry fees are lacking, or if not properly conditioned for the show.

9. **REMOVAL OF EXHIBIT:** No exhibit will be removed before the date and time stated in the rules for each department as provided in State Rule II-14 and Auction Sales Rules. (Early removal will result in forfeiting any premiums due to the exhibitor. This rule will be rigidly enforced.) Due to the possibility of loss, ribbons may not be placed on display. Ribbons and premium checks will be available in the department when you pick up your exhibits.

10. **NO DOGS,** except ADA Authorized Service Dogs are allowed on the fairgrounds. No exceptions.

11. **CAMPING:** Will be in the upper picnic area. Minors must be accompanied by parent/guardian. No underage drinking allowed. Proof of insurance registration presented with reservation. See Camping Page for details.

12. **FINAL CLOSING: The Fair will close Exhibits to visitors at 6:00 p.m. ON SUNDAY, October 2nd, 2022.**

13. SAN BENITO COUNTY 4-H PARTICIPATION

REQUIREMENTS: Membership in the University of California, San Benito County 4-H Program is open to all children in Kindergarten through 19 years of age without regard to race, religion, sex or physical handicap who reside within San Benito County school district boundaries and/or are legally in attendance at a San Benito County school. Youth residing in a county other than San Benito must have the approval of the 4-H Youth Development Advisor from their home county and the San Benito County 4-H Youth Development Advisor and the community club leader of the club he/she seeks to join. Families enrolled in a San Benito 4-H club prior to this policy being implemented, will be allowed to continue participating in the program as long as they have the approval of the 4-H Youth Development of both counties annually. SBCF recognizes all 4-H enrollment requirements.

14. MONTEREY AND SANTA CRUZ COUNTY PARTICIPATION

REQUIREMENTS: Must be enrolled in a 4-H Club Program based in Monterey or Santa Cruz county. FFA exhibitors must be enrolled in a FFA Chapter in a Monterey or Santa Cruz school.

14. **FRAUDULENT ENTRIES:** If after the judges have made their awards, the Association finds that an exhibitor has improperly and falsely entered any exhibit, said exhibitor will forfeit all rights to all premiums that may have been awarded him/her in all departments of the Fair.

15. **CANCELLED ENTRIES:** Exhibitors canceling their entries in Livestock or Horse Show for any reason after the official date for the closing of the entries, excepting written verification by a qualified veterinarian, shall forfeit their entry fees. Veterinary certificates must state the date of inspection and the nature of disqualification and must be filed in the Fairgrounds office at least 24 hours prior to the start of the Fair. This rule will be rigidly enforced.

16. **Leader/Advisor Signature Procedure:** Due to the online entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows: after entry closing date a list of all online entries (livestock and non-livestock) for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader/FFA Advisor/Grange Leader. There will be an email for each leader/advisor asking to certify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2022 fair. This signed sheet **MUST** be emailed, faxed or postmarked by September 8th, 2022 (no metered mail).

17. **STILL EXHIBIT RULE – REQUIRED 2022**

Attention all 4-H, Independent and FFA exhibitors entering exhibits in any MARKET class. Each Market Exhibitor is required to enter and deliver at least one entry in either the 4-H Stills or the FFA Stills. All entries must have been made, collected, grown or prepared within one year of the opening date of the 2022 fair. 4-H EDUCATIONAL POSTERS AND FFA EDUCATIONAL POSTERS DO NOT SATISFY THIS RULE. See page 6 for receiving date and time. All entries to be delivered to the Youth Exhibits Hall. **FAILURE TO DELIVER THE REQUIRED ENTRY WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION OF ALL MARKET ENTRIES IN THIS YEARS FAIR.** Animals will be sent home. No exceptions. All other rules stated in the exhibitor handbook apply.

Matting using a windowed mat. Windowed mats can be purchased at Aaron Brothers, Michaels and online. Typically, an 11x14 inch size mat will have a window for an 8x10 photo, and a 16x20 inch mat will have a window for an 11x14 inch photo.

1. Position the photo face up behind the window part of the mat.
2. Once you settle on how the photo looks through the window, tape the photo to the back of the window part of the mat.
3. Now use double-sided tape to adhere the window part to the back part of the mat or leave the back of the mat back off.
4. Label your photo on the upper left corner when facing the back of the mat.

Matting with art-board or foam core. (Difficult to get right)

1. Cut the foam core to 11x14 inches or 16x20 inches depending on your division. Use a stiff plastic or metal straight edge (T-Square or metal ruler) and sharp hobby knife or similar on a nice flat cutting board instead of a paper cutter or scissors. Watch your fingers! Try to be as neat as possible. The border of mat can be 1 to two inches on all sides.
2. Position the photo on the cut foam core or art-board, making sure that it is in the center of the board both top to bottom and left to right. Mark the edges of the photo on the foam core lightly with a lightly penciled rectangle or dots at the 4 corners of the photo.
3. Place the photo on a scrap of cardboard face down and spray the back of the photo with spray glue. You could use Elmer's non-wrinkle rubber cement/or double-sided tape. There are two types of spray glue (permanent and repositionable). If permanent, you only need to spray the back of the photo. If repositionable, spray the foam core or art board as well. To do this lightly tape paper to four sides of the foam core creating a masked window to spray the glue right where the photo will be placed. Exact alignment is important.
4. Place the photo carefully on the art board starting at one edge. Wax paper can also be used to help position the photo; then can be pulled away to allow the photo to adhere to the mat.
5. Carefully erase any pencil marks.
6. Label your photo on the upper left corner of the back.

Concerns about hanging

Velcro or special hanging hooks do not need to be attached to the back when matted. Photos on aluminum or canvas should have a method for hanging suitable for the size and weight of the photo.

Special Instructions:

Photo Art: Tape an envelope to back of photo containing 3x5s or 4x6s of original photo or photos you used before it was altered. The photos will be displayed beside the photo art piece.

Panorama Photos: Try to maintain a photo height of 6 inches or more; width can vary. Mount on art board or foam core.

Humorous: Attach 3x5 card with an optional humorous caption.

Flashback: Two photos same size side by side (early photo on left, current photo on right) or a composite of both side by side.

1. HORSE DRUG FEE: *A fee of \$14.00 will be charged for each horse in the horse show classes that will be competing in an event that is covered by the California Horse Drugging Act. See Division 900.*
NO HORSE SHOW IS EXEMPT FROM THIS REQUIREMENT.

2. HORSE SHOW: Unless other rules are specified, rules and definitions for conducting each class as contained in the rule book of USEF will apply to this Horse Show provided they do not conflict with any of the rules and regulations prescribed by the Division of Fairs and Expositions of the California Department of Food and Agriculture.

3. FOR HORSE SHOW PURPOSES the age of the individual on January 1st, 2022 will be maintained throughout the entire year for Junior classes (see California State Rules, Section XI, rule 1).

4. THREE (3) ENTRIES BY TWO (2) OR MORE EXHIBITORS WILL CONSTITUTE A MINIMUM CLASS. Where entries are less than for a minimum class at the close of entry, the class may be cancelled or combined. This decision will be made by management and department chairs. An exhibitor in a cancelled or combined class, will be notified one (1) week prior to the class. Cancelled class entry fees will be refunded. NOTE: Lead Line and Walk Trot classes will be held with less than five (5) entries.

5. LEATHER CURB STRAPS or FLAT CHAIN CURB STRAPS: Horses in Western bridle classes in judged events, except walk-trot and cutting classes, must be shown in leather curb (1/2) strap. 4-H & FFA Junior Exhibitors may show in flat chain curb straps.

6. Each exhibitor will have one number that must be worn when showing.

7. NO SHOW OR CONTEST OFFICIAL OR MEMBER OF THE IMMEDIATE FAMILY SHALL ENTER OR EXHIBIT HORSES IN ANY SHOW OR CONTEST AT WHICH HE/SHE IS OFFICIATING, nor may any horse owned by such person be entered or exhibited. A show contest official shall be defined as any such person performing the duties of a show manager, judge steward, Ring Steward or show secretary. Duties include but are not limited to: a. Contacting or hiring of judges; and b. Acceptance of entries or entry fees. Immediate family means married persons and any children or other relatives living in the same household of either or both married persons.

8. EXHIBITORS OF HORSES ARE WARNED that any subject of discourtesy or disobedience to officials on the part of the owner, exhibitor, trainer, groom or rider will disqualify horse/exhibitor combination and the owner forfeits his/her winnings. The San Benito County Fair and the Horse Show Department reserves the power to remove any owner, exhibitor, trainer, groom, horse / rider or horse/exhibitor combination from the horse show without being liable for compensation.

9. PAYMENTS TO WINNERS will be made by check within two weeks of the event. Checks will be mailed to the address on the entry.

5. **STALLS AND PENS MUST BE NEATLY KEPT:**

They must be supplied with necessary clean bedding. Pathways approaches and aisles between barns MUST be kept clean for the convenience of spectators. This work must be completed by 7:30 a.m. each day. NO EXCEPTIONS.

6. **RECEIVING TIME for JUNIOR BREEDING ANIMALS:**

Tuesday, September 27th, 2022 for swine, sheep, dairy goats and commercial meat does, beef, and dairy cattle by 6:00 p.m.

Livestock arriving at the Fair will be inspected at a designated check point prior to weigh-in. Livestock will be thoroughly checked for fungus and any health-related problems. Livestock with health issues will not be allowed to show and must be removed from the fairgrounds immediately.

7. **BREEDING ANIMALS:**

Beef cattle, Dairy cattle, Sheep and Goats in the Junior Divisions are open to Monterey, San Benito and Santa Cruz County residents, on a LIMITED SPACE AVAILABLE BASIS.

8. **ENTRIES RELEASED:**

Breeding animals and feeders are released after their show. They can be loaded out before 8:00 a.m. any day after they show and MUST be removed from the grounds by 3:00 p.m. Friday September 30th, 2022. Animals may not be removed after 8:00 a.m.

unless deemed necessary by chairperson and Veterinarian for health reasons. Excess tack may be WALKED all the way out any day before 8:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. and may be driven out Sunday between 4:30 p.m. - 5:30 p.m.

Fair closes on Sunday October 2nd, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. Please stage items to be loaded and observe a 5-MINUTE loading time limit. EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS MUST BE LEFT IN PLACE UNTIL 4:30 p.m. Sunday October 2nd, 2022.

9. **SAN BENITO COUNTY MARKET EXHIBITORS WILL BE LIMITED TO:**

ONE (1) LARGE AND ONE (1) SMALL ANIMAL.

• Small Animals defined as: Rabbit Meat Pen, Meat Chickens and Turkeys

• Large Animals defined as: Sheep, Goat, Swine and Beef

10. **SANTA CRUZ AND MONTEREY COUNTY MARKET EXHIBITORS ARE LIMITED TO:**

ONE (1) ENTRY PER EXHIBITOR. MARKET BEEF, GOATS, SHEEP, SWINE, POULTRY AND RABBIT MEAT PEN.

11. **NO MORE THAN ONE OWNERSHIP ON EACH ENTRY FORM.** Livestock must be solely owned by and under exhibitor's care and management. Project must be under supervision of an organization to be eligible to show. Exception - horses and dairy cattle can be leased.

12. **PROTEST** – refer to State Rule V, rules 1 through 15. Decision of Livestock Superintendent cannot be protested and is final. All protests must be presented to the management of the Fair within 24 hours of the alleged violation, or 24 hours after the results are available to the public of exhibits judged pre-fair. Protest must be accompanied by a \$500 deposit (cash, money order or certified check) which will be returned only if the protest is determined valid. Protest and appropriate action are decided by the Fair's Board of Directors or designees in a timely manner.

13. **AN EXHIBITOR WILL BE DISQUALIFIED** from his/her class, if he/she fails to be present and ready to perform within three (3) minutes from the time his/her class or number is called.

14. **CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION** for all market species will return for Overall Grand Champion. Doesn't include Rabbits and Poultry.

15. **BEDDING STRAW** may be used for Dairy Cattle ONLY. SHAVINGS ONLY for all livestock. NO PELLET BEDDING.

NO BEDDING WILL BE FURNISHED BY THE FAIR.

16. ****NO HANDS-ON POLICY**** (All Junior Livestock Exhibitors): All projects must be under the exhibitor's care and management. Junior exhibitors (the owner of the exhibit) are required to groom their own animals, however they may be assisted in grooming, clipping or blocking by another junior livestock exhibitor of the San Benito County Fair. Anyone who is determined by management to require help from an adult, shall be granted such, in writing prior to the Fair. The use of professional groomers will be cause for disqualification of the exhibitor and/or animal. Disqualification consists of the withholding of premium money and ribbons, elimination from further competition and/or removal from the auction.

17. **LIVESTOCK SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS:** The member fairs of the Western Fairs Association are uniting to support ethical and humane treatment of all animals exhibited at our fairs and expositions, as

well as reinforcing the educational emphasis of competitive programs for animals and maintaining the highest integrity standard of all participants. Henceforth, the member fairs of the Western Fairs Association have adopted drafts of the National Show Ring Code of Ethics as proposed by the American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association in Jun. 1995 and the Code for Show Ring Ethics drafted by the International Association of Fairs and Expositions as working guidelines for member fairs. The Show Ring code of ethics expresses the belief that we should exhibit animals on their own merits and each animal should be handled properly with attention towards its needs.

18. ANIMAL OWNERSHIP: SBCF minimum ownership requirements for 2022 are Beef, a minimum of 120 consecutive days and must be tagged on or before May 26th, 2022. Lambs, goats and hog ownership requirement is a minimum of 60 consecutive days and must be tagged on or before July 29th, 2022.

19. See LOCAL RULES & REGULATIONS, Page 9, concerning the required Still Exhibit. Failure to comply will result in DISQUALIFICATION of all Market Entries for an exhibitor.

20. PARKING:
ALL VEHICLES MUST BE PARKED IN DESIGNATED AREAS.
Vehicles parked in other areas of the Fairgrounds will be towed away at the owner's expense.
TRAILERS MAY NOT BE LEFT ON THE FAIRGROUNDS.
If removing breeding animals, trailers may be brought in, animal loaded and then removed.
NO trailer parking on the Fairgrounds during the Fair.

21. Award recipient Thank You letters, by club, are due to the Awards Chair, April Mistretta Sunday, October 2nd, 2022 between 12 p.m. – 2 p.m. in the main arena. Envelope must be addressed, stamped and unsealed. Please write the name of the award on the upper left-hand corner of envelope.

22. WATER CONSERVATION RULES: All hoses at wash racks will be required to use a shut-off nozzle. Non-use of nozzle will ban member from washing animal on the fairgrounds. In addition, an exhibitor may be subject to a \$50.00 fine for non-compliance. The San Benito County Fair appreciates your assistance in conserving water. Thank you.

23. PARTNER FOR A SAFE FAIR: The goal of the Fair Board is to present a fair that is not only fun, but safe for exhibitors and other guests. We ask that all fair livestock exhibitors and their families observe safe practices in the barns. For the protection of our exhibitors and the preservation of the pens, there is to be no climbing on the bars of the pens. Only proper electrical outlets should be used with no overloading or hazardous placement of cords. Reducing the risk of food contamination is critical. Observing the 'no food or beverage' policy in the barns is REQUIRED. Signage will be posted to remind both exhibitors and fair guests that food consumption is PROHIBITED in barns. Additionally, signage will stress the policy of guests not touching livestock. Hand washing is an essential protective practice for our exhibitors and guests alike. Postings will also be placed in and around the barns and hand washing stations. We thank our livestock exhibitors for their partnership in reducing potential risks.

24. All club rest areas will be in the U-Barn. First come first choice of ONE (1) stall and area in front of it. Tables and any more than two (2) chairs in the barns will be asked to move to rest area.

ICE CHESTS NOT ALLOWED IN BARN!
May be in rest areas and can ONLY contain drinking water.
Subject to search by Security.

25. A \$5.00 Security Fee is included in the Entry Fee for large animals.

2022 JUNIOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT

The following Code of Conduct has been developed by the Board of the 33rd DAA, management, staff and volunteers to ensure a safe and comfortable environment for our exhibitors, families and guests at the San Benito County Fair.

By submitting an entry to the Fair in the Livestock Department or any other Youth department, both the youth exhibitor and their parents/guardians and leaders who sign their forms, agree to these rules and the consequences should they be broken.

We are working to provide a place for young people to learn from their successes as well as their challenges. We understand that competition and working with animals in a new environment sometimes creates frustration. We feel that managing that frustration professionally and positively is a vital part of the learning experience. We require everyone on our grounds to heed the following Code of Conduct at all times during our event.

Policy for Exhibitor Conduct

1. Exhibitors must feed and care for their animals twice daily. Animals must be provided fresh water daily and their pens must be cleaned daily. Shavings should appear fresh and not be soaked with waste.
2. Minors in possession of or being under the influence of alcohol on the Fairgrounds is prohibited and also illegal. If this is suspected at any time during the Fair events, law enforcement will be contacted and the exhibitor risks removal from the grounds for the remainder of the events. Illegal drugs are NEVER allowed on the Fairgrounds.
3. Smoking or vaping is not allowed in the Barns at any time or on the Fairgrounds for any exhibitor under 18 years of age.
4. Any exhibitor acting violently, brandishing a weapon or item used as a weapon, fighting or risking the safety of another exhibitor in any way, will be contacted by security/law enforcement and removed from the grounds for the remainder of the events.
5. Exhibitors must always remember they are representing their industry, their families and themselves to the public while they are at the Fair. Poor care of animals, hitting them hard enough to leave marks, excessive mess in the public areas of the barns, foul language, and loud boisterous behavior or fighting is against the code of conduct.
6. Judges' decisions are final. Exhibitor will not talk back or argue with the judge or judges' decision.
7. Posts on social media will be respectful to all and considerate of the Agriculture and Fair industries we are part of. Disparaging posts about Judges, staff, volunteers or other exhibitors is against the code of conduct.

Policy for Adult Leader/Parent/Guardian Code of Conduct

Adults have a responsibility to guide youth exhibitors by teaching, encouraging and setting good examples.

1. Respect and courtesy for other adults, leaders, staff and volunteers is required at all times. Verbal or physical arguments between adults are not acceptable. We are in a position to teach our young people how to handle successes and frustrations with maturity and dignity. Fighting or loud arguments between adults is a violation of the code of conduct. If security or law enforcement is needed to intervene, the participating adults will be asked to leave the Fairgrounds immediately.
2. Adults responsible for youth exhibitors will not carry, consume or store alcohol in the barn area during the youth livestock show, sale and exhibit. Alcohol may be purchased from Fair vendors and/or at the JLA Auction hospitality area and enjoyed responsibly outside of the barn area. Carrying outside alcohol and/or leaving it where it is available to a minor is against the code of conduct.
3. Judges' decisions are final. Parents and adults will not argue with the judge or judges' decision.
4. Posts on social media will be respectful to all and considerate of the Agriculture and Fair industries we are part of. Disparaging posts about Judges, staff, volunteers or other exhibitors is against the code of conduct.

Violation of the Code of Conduct could result in the expulsion of the exhibitor, parents, club or chapter and their animals from the Fairgrounds. This includes forfeiture of awards, auction sales and possible suspension for future Fair activities. Please be kind, be safe and represent yourself, your family and your community in an excellent way!

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SPECIAL RULES

SPECIAL 4-H CLUB Rules and Regulations:

1. All eligibility and age limitations as per county 4-H participation Requirements (See Local Rules).
2. The 4-H show uniform to be worn by all 4-H exhibitors and by helpers in individual and club groups while showing at the horse show and livestock shows shall consist of: 4-H cap (must be worn on head or be visible tucked in belt loop or pocket), white shirt or blouse (short or long sleeve). Absolutely no midribs or sleeveless shirts are to be worn. Pants may be white or black (no acid wash) must be long enough to cover the ankles. If pants have belt loops, belt must be worn.

SPECIAL FFA CHAPTER RULES:

1. The official FFA Show Uniform to be worn by all FFA exhibitors and by helpers in individual and chapter groups while showing at fairs and livestock shows shall consist of white trousers, white dress shirt (short or long sleeves) with FFA emblem attached to the left pocket and the official FFA four-in-hand necktie. The official FFA jacket is REQUIRED; Judges will make the call for heat making jackets not required. Hats or headgear (except if showing in light horse classes) of any kind shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing.
2. Students competing in this division must be regularly enrolled in the high school vocational agriculture program and must meet the requirements, rules and regulations set up by the C.A.T.A. and the State Association of FFA.
3. All entries in this division must be from projects carried as a part of the regular high school agricultural program and must be owned by the student.

SPECIAL INDEPENDENT & GRANGE JUNIOR EXHIBITOR RULES:

1. Exhibitors not affiliated with any organization can enter appropriate 4-H classes, if they meet the following requirements: Independent exhibitors must be at least 9 years old or in the 4th Grade by January 1st, 2022. Exhibitors are eligible to compete / exhibit through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age.
2. Independent Juniors must not have been in a junior organization within one (1) year of the Fair to be eligible to participate.
3. Dress code for Independent Juniors for showing livestock:
 - a. White or solid black jeans – No acid wash
 - b. White shirt, long or short sleeves
 - c. Belt
 - d. Clean & polished boots or shoes – No pant legs tucked in boots
 - e. ABSOLUTELY NO MIDRIFTS OR SLEEVELESS SHIRTS.
4. All independent exhibitors will show in 4H division.

FAILURE TO FOLLOW RULES BELOW WILL RESULT IN FORFEITURE OF AWARDS AND/OR MONIES.

Rules and Regulations

1. **Leader / Advisor Signature Procedure:** Due to the online entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows: after entry closing date a list of all entries (livestock and non-

livestock) for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader/FFA Advisor/Grange Leader. There will be a one-page sheet for each leader/advisor to certify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2022 fair. This signed sheet MUST be mailed, faxed or mailed back to the fair by September 16th, 2022.

2. EAR TAG NUMBER(S) MUST BE LISTED CORRECTLY ON ENTRY FORM. Animal will not be permitted to enter the Fair if ear tag number does not match entry form. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**
3. ALL LIVESTOCK MUST ARRIVE CLEAN AND IN SHOW CONDITION.
4. All sheep and goats MUST have a scrapie tag to show.
5. **Certificate of Drug Medication MUST be filled out, properly signed and turned in at Receiving.**

6. If a market animal is considered not market ready by the judge, then the animal is not eligible for sale.

7. The exhibitor of any animal considered wild by the livestock committee will be asked to remove the animal from the fair.
8. All animals must be able to be led by the exhibitor while at the fair.

9. ALL EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR CLEANING, FEEDING AND WATERING THEIR LIVESTOCK UNTIL RELEASE ON Sunday, October 2nd, 2022. Exhibitors not feeding or watering animals on Sun. will forfeit all award and auction monies.

10. All market animals must be pre-tagged on specified dates. Parent & Exhibitor must be present day of tagging. In the event exhibitor and parent cannot be present, a leader or designated representative may fill in providing this change is approved by Fair management in writing two weeks prior to the tagging date. **Pre-tagging of an animal is NOT an automatic entry in the San Benito County Fair.** Exhibitors must enter pre-tagged animals and pay all fees by the entry deadline to be eligible to participate in the fair (see page 1).

11. Three (3) entries will constitute a minimum class. Where entries are less than for a minimum class at the close of entry, the class may be cancelled or combined. This decision will be made by management and department chairs.

12. Animals not sold through the auction, (breeding, feeders and show birds) **MUST be removed from the grounds by 3:00 p.m. Friday September 30th, 2022.**

13. No practice roping or bicycles in livestock area, or anywhere during Fair.

POSTMORTEM EXAMINATIONS

The San Benito County Fair reserves the right to perform a postmortem examination of any animal which dies at the San Benito County Fair. If required, this must be performed by an official veterinarian at the expense of the exhibitor.

1. The San Benito County Fair, to encourage the boys and girls of San Benito, Monterey and Santa Cruz Counties in their livestock projects, will hold a terminal auction sale of market livestock starting at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, October 1st, 2022.

2. All beef, sheep, swine and market goats that are market ready will be sold at auction. Over-all Champion & Reserve Champion, Third, Fourth and Fifth place meat pens of rabbits and poultry, if market ready, will be sold.

3. When an entry is made in the market divisions, it is automatically consigned to the San Benito County Fair Junior Livestock Auction. This pertains to market ready animals only.

4. EXHIBITORS AND THEIR INSTRUCTORS OR LEADERS MUST BE PRESENT AT THE TIME OF THE SALE. If owner is not present, the animal will not be sold in auction, but it will be sold at market price established for resale animals. Owner must be in official uniform per Junior Livestock Special Rules. Owners/Exhibitors may have help from another exhibitor if needed, but MUST be present.

5. All livestock will be weighed Tuesday, September 27th, 2022 between 1:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Each entry will be weighed only once. Substitutions will not be permitted.

6. A sales fee of 8% will be charged by the Auction Committee on all animals sold, this includes Add-On's, to cover hauling and other expenses, including condemnation by Federal inspection. The following will be deducted from auction check: \$1.00 from all Market Beef for Beef Promotion, \$0.40 per \$100.00 gross market value (0.4%) Selling Charge from all Swine for Pork Promotion, and \$.007 per pound on lambs for sheep promotion.

7. A \$13.00 charge will be withheld from each auction check for all market animals to cover cost of two (2) 4" x 6" color pictures taken of each exhibitor and animal.

8. Livestock will be sold in the order determined by the auction committee. The order for the 2022 San Benito County Fair Junior Livestock auction is as follows:

11. ANIMAL OWNERSHIP: See Livestock Local Rule #11 on Page 66.

12. To streamline the Junior Livestock Auction at the San Benito County Fair we will be accepting credit cards. Payment must be made the day of the Auction by check, cash or credit card.

13. ANIMALS MUST BE SOLD THROUGH THE JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION TO BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE ANY ADD-ON PAYMENTS. ADD-ON MINIMUM IS \$30 AND MUST BE RECEIVED IN HAND BY 5:00 p.m. ON SALE DAY.

14. SELLERS WILL BE PAID BY CHECK TO BE RELEASED TO 4-H LEADERS, FFA ADVISORS, GRANGE LEADERS AND/OR THEIR DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVES AT THE SAN BENITO COUNTY FAIR ENTRY OFFICE ON Friday, November 18th, 2022 BETWEEN 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. FORMAL PROXY LETTERS WILL BE REQUIRED. INDEPENDENT JUNIORS CAN PICKUP THEIR CHECKS AT THAT TIME. If checks need to be reissued for loss or stale date, a \$30.00 fee will be required to re-issue the check. Rules & Regulations:

1. Exhibitor must show their own market animal if they are exhibiting a market animal. Exhibitor can only show a breeding animal if this is the only animal they are exhibiting.
2. All 4-H and FFA Horse Show exhibitors need to SEPARATELY enter Horse Showmanship.
3. Exhibitors shall be on hand and ready to exhibit at the time called for judging. After one call if exhibitor is not present then he/she will be dismissed from the class. No exceptions.
4. First and second-class winners of 4-H Novice, 4-H Junior and FFA Novice are eligible to advance to the next level of showmanship.
5. All exhibitors are required to wear the show uniform of the organization they represent. (Girls may wear slacks instead of skirts.) See uniform regulations under Junior Livestock Special Rules.
6. Only animals owned, fitted and shown by the exhibitor in the Junior Livestock Department divisions are eligible. Horses in the Horse Show are also eligible. Bulls, stallions, rams, boars and Billy goats are not eligible for showmanship.
7. Rabbit Showmanship participants must wear long sleeve shirts or blouses.
8. Showmanship classes are based on age as of January 1st of current year.
9. Definitions:

4-H PRIMARY: Open to 4-H member from 5 years old to 9 years old and can show in the class every year until they become official 4-H age of 9 years old and in the 4th grade.

4-H NOVICE: Open to 4-H members 9 years old through 10 years old who have never shown this species of animal at any fair. Note: First and second place winners may advance to 4-H Junior Showmanship. Any member who has shown in Novice Showmanship at any fair will advance to Junior Showmanship.

4-H JUNIOR: Open to 4-H members 11 years old through 13 years old regardless of experience and number of years in 4-H. 9 years old through 10 years old who have already shown in Novice Showmanship at any fair. First and second place winners may advance to 4-H Senior Showmanship.

4-H SENIOR: Open to any 4-H member 14 years old through 19 years of age regardless of the number of years in 4-H.

FFA NOVICE: Exhibitors showing this species for the first time and that have never shown this species previously in this or any other organization. Note: First and second place winners may advance to FFA Advanced Showmanship.

FFA ADVANCED: Open to any FFA member regardless of the number of years showing.

4. Any duplication of ear markings, by one exhibitor in same Breed and Class will not be allowed. Entries with duplicate ear numbers will have one of those rabbits eliminated. The entry fee will not be returned.
5. Animals will be shown and judged in show room divisions recognized by the ARBA. Divisions will be established by the number of rabbits entered in any given breed and any given variety with in that breed.
6. The judge will eliminate from the show those animals which have disqualifications from competition. They will count when computing the number of rabbits shown in the class.
7. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to take the rabbit to the show table when the class is called for it to be judged. Those rabbits absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of rabbits in the class.

- **The SBCF will be following the guidelines put forth by the ARBA regarding any RHD outbreaks. The guidelines are subject to change as ARBA sees fit and could possibly change after the publication of the 2022 Guidebook. We will follow any guidelines in place as of the date of the fair. We will make any and all attempts to notify exhibitors of any changes. If the breeding show is cancelled, all entries will be refunded.**

- **IF there is a RHD outbreak, the SBCF Market Rabbit Show will NOT be cancelled. The rules will change as follows to prevent any possible exposures. Emails will be sent to market exhibitors with any updates and further instructions.**

1. **ALL market pens will be terminal, all pens to be processed immediately. Places 1-5 will be sold through auction and exhibitor present for sale. Pictures will be taken day of show.**

2. **Rabbits NOT making the sale will be included in the processing. The exhibitor will have two options. 1) They can pick up the processed pen for their own consumption. 2) The exhibitor will be paid the rate of \$75.00 per processed pen from a private treaty buyer for the processed pen.**

- **As of 2/1/22 the guidelines are as follows:**

Any ARBA sanction held by a club within 50 miles of an active Domestic RHD outbreak or 25 miles of an active Wild / Feral outbreak will be cancelled, and the club provided the opportunity to reschedule the date / location for a future show.

Exhibitors, judges, registrars, transporters, and vendors residing in or traveling by motor vehicle through an area of the country that is part of an active RHD outbreak are discouraged from attending ARBA sanctioned shows in other areas or having contact with other rabbit breeders for 30 days of the last RHD confirmed positive case.

The purpose of this contest is to provide added incentive for the students to continually strive to raise better quality market beef that will meet industry standards. This contest will provide the student with a carcass evaluation only.

NOTE: THERE WILL BE NO ENTRY FOR THIS CONTEST.
4-H AND FFA BEEF WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY ENTERED

Cash award through 10th place.

1. All market beef are entered in the Carcass Contest. No live pickups.
2. All animals entered in the Carcass Contest must be shown in the market beef classes of the exhibitor's respective division. 4-H and FFA will be judged together.
3. The animals will be sold in the Junior Livestock Auction.
4. Entry in the Carcass Contest will be automatic for all animals sold through the Junior Livestock Auction.
5. All animals entered in this contest will be consigned to a packing house designated by the Fair.
6. Carcasses will be graded at the packing house by USDA graders and results compiled by department chairs and industry professional.
7. All carcasses must grade USDA Top Select or higher to be eligible for cash awards. Results will be calculated for all market beef entered.
8. Placing will be based on grid placing; ties will be broken by yield grade and quality grade.
9. The Carcass Evaluations /Awards Presentation will be held on November 1st, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in the Oak room.
10. The Carcass Contest will include a "Rate of Gain." Rate of Gain will be calculated by using the following formula. All Rate of Gain Steers will be weighed at the same time. Fair scale weight minus starting weight (at weigh-in & tag) divided by the number of days on feed equals average weight gain. Rate of gain will be ranked by the animal that highest average daily gain to the lowest.

2. Exhibitors, who should win more than one species of Showmanship, must designate the species they will represent during Round Robin, **No later than Friday night at 5:00 p.m. in the Fair Livestock Office.** They will need to notify the species Chair at that time. The second-place winner of a class NOT CHOSEN BY THE WINNER will then be eligible to compete. If the second-place winner chooses not to show, we will contact the following placings in order until a designated delegate for that species is secured to ensure a full class for Round Robin.

3. If an exhibitor wins both Junior and Senior 4-H Showmanship for the same species, they have the option to pick which Round Robin class to participate in. The next placed exhibitor in the class not chosen will have the opportunity to participate until the delegate for the class is secured.

4. Animals to be shown for Round Robin will be chosen by the species Chair.

5. Exhibitors will be assigned numbers for animals to be shown.

6. If a defect or injury is found by exhibitor on animal it must be mentioned to judge or Chair.

7. Species shown will be Market Goats, Dairy Goats, Sheep, Swine, Beef and Dairy Cattle. No Horses, Rabbits or Poultry will be shown in the Round Robin competition; however, the winners of those species are still eligible to compete.

If there are not enough animals of a species to complete a round, then that species will be eliminated from the Round Robin competition. The showmanship winner of that species is still eligible to compete in Round Robin.

8. If an exhibitor chooses not to show a species for any reason, that person can sit out of the class and receive the highest score relative to the number of exhibitors in the class. For example, nine exhibitors = 9 score for that species not shown.

9. Judge's decision will be final.

10. It will be at the Judges' discretion to have an animal removed if they deem necessary for any reason.

11. In the event of a tie score, the exhibitor who won the most classes for the species shown will be placed first for the competition.

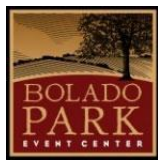
