How to Enter the Fair

- 1. Visit **http://sanbenito.fairwire.com** for the SBCF online entries home page, entries open August 1st. Please see Dates to Remember in guidebook.
- Livestock Exhibitors MUST have your Tag Id's, Scrapie Id's, Leg Band numbers, Registration Papers & completed YQCA Certificate by entry close date. Please have necessary documents ready to upload. Entry will be invalid if Tag Id information is missing or incorrect. Hog Exhibitors need Prop 12 certification form information from their breeder https://www.sanbenitocountyfair.com/wp-content/uploads/2023/05/Market-Swine-Prop-12-Self-Certification.pdf https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/AHFSS/AnimalCare/docs/AnimalCareFairsExhibitions.pdf
- 3. Register as a "new" exhibitor. Complete the steps required for your personal information.
- 4. Click "Add Entry" and choose a "Department".
- 5. Within each department you will be asked to choose a "Class" and information pertaining to your entry
 - a. Please answer each question accurately
 - b. You may add additional information such as a Title or a Description about your item
 - c. Continue to add additional entries
 - d. Pay special attention to filling out your entries. Be sure that your name, address, and city are clear on each section. Whenever signatures on affidavits are necessary, be sure they are supplied. Check your department, division, and class numbers carefully with the Exhibitor Handbook prior to entering. Wrong department, division or class numbers appearing can lead to disqualification if not corrected in time. When in doubt, please don't hesitate to check with the Fair entry office during business hours 831-628-3421 or email anytime entry@sanbenitocountyfair.com.
- 6. When entries are complete, follow the prompts to complete your shopping cart and pay for your entries
 - Remember! You must click "Save Cart" in order for your account to be saved
 - After "saving your cart" you may come back to pay at a later date (but don't forget!)
 - Any "carts" not paid for by August 24th, at 11:59 p.m. will not be accepted!

NO EXCEPTIONS!!

- Entry Office will be available until 6:00 p.m. on August 24th and available on Friday, August 25th until 10:00 a.m. to answer any questions.
- DO NOT wait until the last minute, as there will be a \$25.00 charge for this assistance.

- 1. Receiving Procedure will remain same.
 - Addition: <u>ONE</u> (1) person from each department will be available to "Meet & Greet" with the Exhibitors from each department.
 - Youth Ambassador's will handle exhibit Check-In **ONLY**. NO changes will be made at the table.
 - Checked-In Exhibits will be taken to their individual departments for exhibit card changes if need be. Once changes have been made, exhibit cards need to be returned to the Entry Office for final printing.

<u>Market</u>

- 1. Dates to Remember
 - May 25th Beef Tagging
 - July 10th Tag Id email requests due to Entry Office by 4:00 p.m.
 - July 13th Tag Id pick up 4:00 p.m. 6:00 p.m.
 - July 28th Tag Id Form, Tagging Sheets, Photos and unused Tag Id's due to Entry Office
- 2. ***NEW*** Leaders / Advisors: Tag Id's for all Market Sheep, Goats and Swine must be requested by email to the Entry Office. entry@sanbenitocountyfair.com.
 - Tagging <u>MUST</u> be done by specie Leader / Advisor for all Market Livestock. Tags are NOT to be given out for self-tagging.
 - *NEW* Market Exhibitors will be required to upload three (3) photos of their market animal with Tag Id in place.
 - Full front photo with ear notching, ear Tag Id visible and legible.
 - Full back photo of animal's head.
 - Full side photo view of animal.
 - Photos are due with tagging sheet by July 28th at 4:00 p.m.. NO EXCEPTIONS!
 - REMINDER In case of lost required ear tag, exhibitor <u>MUST</u> notify Entry Office within 24 hours. Species Chairperson will be notified, and arrangements made to retag animal. Failure to report will result in disqualification of entry.
- 3. Weigh-In and Check-In Day:
 - Tag Id's, Scrapie Tags (USDA REQUIRED) and ALL necessary Registration Papers will be verified.

- 4. 4-H, Independent and FFA Exhibitors:
 - Do Not forget your <u>MANDATORY</u> Still Exhibit for Market Livestock! One Still Exhibit is MANDATORY for all 4-H, Independent, FFA Livestock Exhibitors (exception with Primary Members for Rabbits & Poultry).
 - YQCA Certificates must be completed by entry deadline, August 24th.
 - Please upload necessary paperwork and photos online with entries.
 - Entry will be invalid if Tag Id information is missing or incorrect.
- 5. Tack Out: Sunday, October 1st, 4:30 p.m.
- 6. ALL Livestock Classes will follow the Livestock Schedule <u>ONLY</u>, see Page 9.
- 7. NEW for SWINE: Prop 12 Requirement: Please use Official Form at back of Guidebook For more information, please visit https://www.cdfa.ca.gov/AHFSS/AnimalCare/docs/AnimalCareFairsExhibitions.pdf

Showmanship

- 1. Showmanship is included with entry fee. Class must be entered separately.
- 2. Round Robin Exhibitors will be required to bring the following tools: Beef Scotch Comb, Beef Show Stick, and a Swine Whip/Stick.
- 3. Round Robin In the event of a tie score, the Exhibitor who placed higher in the most classes will win the tie. If the tie cannon be broken based on placing, each Exhibitor will be asked a tie breaker question. Questions will be determined and asked by the Round Robin judges.

Junior Livestock Auction

- 1. Auction is a terminal sale. No market animals will be live pick up.
- 2. If a market animal is removed from the property by the exhibitor or any affiliation after weigh-in / consignment, the exhibitor will become ineligible to show or sell livestock at any future San Benito County Fair.
- 3. Buyer letters and Add-On forms are extremely important and are strongly encouraged. Please send out at least 3 per exhibitor.
- 4. Thank You letters for buyer(s) are mandatory. Please have them ready to mail and turn in to your Leader or Advisor by 2:00 p.m. Leaders and Advisor's please turn in by Sunday, October 1st in the Livestock Office before 2:00 p.m.
- 5. Auction checks will be available for pick up on November 17th (subject to change). A \$50.00 fee will be applied to any reprinted, stale, or lost checks.

2023 CALIFORNIA FAIRS STATE RULES

Local Rules and Regulations

- 1. Exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with these rules and to abide by them. All departments in the 2023 San Benito County Fair are open to residents and producers of the 33rd District Agricultural Association (San Benito County). In case of non-residents, producer means bona fide property owners in San Benito County during 2023, the status of which will be determined by the management of the Association through inspection of the county tax records. Also, producers must regularly grow or raise the produce exhibited in San Benito County; if not, their land must be part of that owned or operated in San Benito County. All decisions will be final. Some departments have opened their entries to a wider area. Please check each department to see if other counties are eligible.
- 2. CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES: On-line only close August 24th until 11:59 p.m. NO refunds will be made.
- 3. **JUDGING OF EXHIBITS:** Will occur between Friday, September 23rd and Sunday, October 1st. See judging schedule on pages 8 & 9. American System of Judging: each judged in competition with other entries in its class unless otherwise stated. Danish System of Judging: based upon established standards of quality for each type of product; each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets that standard rather than how it compares with other exhibits.
- 4. **DAMAGE TO STOCK:** The Board of Directors will use every precaution in their power for the safe preservation of all articles and stock on exhibition, but will not be accountable for loss or damage, whatever may be the cause or the extent of damage done. Exhibitors must give attention to their articles or animals during the Fair and at the close of the exhibition.
- 5. **PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS:** Checks will be issued for premiums as soon as possible after the close of the Fair.
- 6. **UNDELIVERED PREMIUMS FORFEITED:** All premiums awarded by the Association will be mailed to the address given on entry form. Undeliverable premiums will be forfeited to the State of California.
- 7. **UNCLAIMED AWARDS:** After 30 days, any unclaimed exhibits or awards become the property of the 33rd District Agricultural Association and may be disposed of.
- 8. **REJECTION OF EXHIBITS:** The Association reserves the right to reject any exhibit improperly entered, or when the ownership is in doubt, or <u>if required entry fees are lacking</u>, or if not properly conditioned for the show.
- 9. **REMOVAL OF EXHIBIT:** No exhibit will be removed before the date and time stated in the rules for each department as provided in State Rule II-14 and Auction Sales Rules. (Early removal will result in forfeiting any premiums due to the exhibitor. This rule will be rigidly enforced.) <u>Due to the possibility of loss, ribbons may not be placed on display.</u> Ribbons and premium checks will be available in the department when you pick up your exhibits.
- 10. **NO DOGS.** Exception for ADA Authorized Service Dogs are allowed.
- 11. **CAMPING:** Will be in the upper picnic area. Minors must be accompanied by parent / guardian. No underage drinking allowed. Proof of insurance and registration must be presented with reservation. See Camping Page for details.
- 12. FINAL CLOSING: The Fair will close Exhibits to visitors at 6:00 p.m. SUNDAY, October 1st.

- 13. **SAN BENITO COUNTY 4-H PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS:** Membership in the University of California, San Benito County 4-H Program is open to all children in kindergarten through 19 years of age without regard to race, religion, sex or physical handicap who reside within San Benito County school district boundaries and/or are legally in attendance at a San Benito County school. Youth residing in a county other than San Benito must have the approval of the 4-H Youth Development Advisor from their home county and the San Benito County 4-H Youth Development Advisor and the community club leader of the club he/she seeks to join. Families enrolled in a San Benito 4-H club prior to this policy being implemented, will be allowed to continue participating in the program as long as they have the approval of the 4-H Youth Development of both counties annually. SBCF recognizes all 4-H enrollment requirements.
- 14. **MONTEREY AND SANTA CRUZ COUNTY PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS:** Must be enrolled in a 4-H Club Program based in Monterey or Santa Cruz County. FFA exhibitors must be enrolled in a FFA Chapter in a Monterey or Santa Cruz school. Exhibitor must live within eligible counties to exhibit.
- 15. **FRAUDULENT ENTRIES:** If after the judges have made their awards, the Association finds that an exhibitor has improperly and falsely entered any exhibit, said exhibitor will forfeit all rights to all premiums that may have been awarded him / her in all departments of the Fair.
- 16. **CANCELLED ENTRIES:** Exhibitors canceling their entries in Livestock or Horse Show for any reason after the official date for the closing of the entries, excepting written verification by a qualified veterinarian, shall forfeit their entry fees. Veterinary certificates must state the date of inspection and the nature of disqualification and must be filed in the Fairgrounds office at least 24 hours prior to the start of the Fair. 



Matting Guidelines:

• Matting using a windowed mat:

- Windowed mats can be purchased at Aaron Brothers, Michaels, and online. Typically, an 11" x 14" inch size mat will have a window for an 8" x 10" photo, and a 16" x 20" inch mat will have a window for an 11" x 14" inch photo. Position the photo face up behind the window part of the mat.
 - Once you settle on how the photo looks through the window, tape the photo to the back of the window part of the mat.
- Now use double-sided tape to adhere the window part to the back part of the mat or leave the back of the mat back off.
- Label your photo on the upper left corner when facing the back of the mat.
- Matting with art-board or foam core. (Difficult to get right):
 - Cut the foam core to 11" x 14" inches or 16" x 20" inches depending on your division. Use a stiff plastic or metal straight edge (T-Square or metal ruler) and sharp hobby knife or similar on a nice flat cutting board instead of a paper cutter or scissors. Watch your fingers! Try to be as neat as possible. The border of mat can be 1 - 2 inches on all sides.
 - Position the photo on the cut foam core or art-board, making sure that it is in the center of the board both top to bottom and left to right. Mark the edges of the photo on the foam core lightly with a lightly penciled rectangle or dots at the 4 corners of the photo.
 - Place the photo on a scrap of cardboard

face down and spray the back of the photo with spray glue. You could use Elmer's non-wrinkle rubber cement/or double-sided tape. There are two types of spray glue (permanent and repositionable). If permanent, you only need to spray the back of the photo. If repositionable, spray the foam core or art board as well. To do this lightly tape paper to four sides of the foam core creating a masked window to spray the glue right where the photo will be placed. Exact alignment is important.

- Place the photo carefully on the art board starting at one edge. Wax paper can also be used to help position the photo; then can be pulled away to allow the photo to adhere to the mat.
- Carefully erase any pencil marks.
- Label your photo on the upper left corner of the back.
- Concerns about hanging
 - Velcro or special hanging hooks do not need to be attached to the back when matted. Photos on aluminum or canvas should have a method for hanging suitable for the size and weight of the photo.

Special Instructions:

- Photo Art
 - Tape an envelope to back of photo containing either a 3 x 5 or 4 x 6 of original photo or photos you used before it was altered. The photos will be displayed beside the photo art piece.
- Panorama Photos
 - Try to maintain a photo height of 6 inches or more; width can vary. Mount on art board or foam core.
- Humorous
 - Attach 3" x 5" card with an optional humorous caption.
- Flashback
 - Two photos same size side by side (early photo on left, current photo on right) or a composite of both side by side.
- Movie / Video
 - Needs a title screen that gives the title, author, actor's names, etc. No more than two minutes in length; Mp4 Codec H264 preferred. If you do not know about formats send them anyway. Email videos to or put the video on an SD or USB stick, place in an envelope that is clearly labeled with your name, address, phone, email, division, and class. Must be

received on or before the receiving dates. No late entries.



- Rules and definitions for conducting each class as contained in the rule book of <u>USEF</u> will apply provided, they do not conflict with any of the rules and regulations prescribed by the Division of Fairs and Expositions of the California Department of Food and Agriculture or unless other rules are specified.
- Contestant's age as of January 1st of current year will be maintained throughout the entire year for Junior classes (see California State Rules, Section XI, rule 1).
- Three (3) entries by two (2) or more exhibitors will constitute a minimum class. Where entries are less than for a minimum class at the close of entry, the class may be cancelled or combined. This decision will be made by management and department chairs. An exhibitor in a cancelled or combined class, will be notified one (1) week prior to the class. Cancelled class entry fees will be refunded. NOTE: Lead Line and Walk Trot classes will be held with less than five (5) entries.
- Leather curb straps or flat chain curb straps: Horses in a Western bridle classes in judged events, except walk / trot and cutting classes, must be shown in leather curb (1/2) strap. 4-H & FFA Junior Exhibitors may show in flat chain curb straps.
- Each exhibitor will have one number that must be worn when showing.
- No show or contest official or member of the immediate family shall enter or exhibit horses in any class or contest at which he / she is officiating. Nor may any horse owned by such person be entered or exhibited. A show contest official shall be defined as any such person performing the duties of a show manager, judge steward, Ring Steward or show secretary. Immediate family

means married persons and any children or other relatives living in the same household of either or both married persons.

- •
- Exhibitors of horses are warned that any subject of discourtesy or disobedience to officials on the part of the owner, exhibitor, trainer, groom or rider will disqualify horse / exhibitor combination and the owner forfeits his / her winnings. The San Benito County Fair and the Horse Show Department reserves the power to remove any owner, exhibitor, trainer, groom, horse / rider, or horse / exhibitor combination from the horse show without being liable for compensation.
- Payout to winners will be made by check within two (2) weeks of the event. Checks will be mailed to the address on the entry.
- Substitutions can only be made within a division. Substitutions must be made when the entry arrives at the fairgrounds. A substitution is considered the horse, not each class in which it is entered. A \$5.00 penalty per horse must be paid prior to judging for each substitution made by the exhibitor.
- An exhibitor will be disqualified from his / her class, if he / she fails to be present and ready to perform within three (3) minutes from the time his / her class or number is called.
- NO post entries allowed.

- LOSS OF EAR TAG:
 - In case of lost required ear tag exhibitor <u>MUST</u> notify Entry Office within 24 hours.
 Species Chairperson will be notified, and arrangements made to retag animal. Failure to report will result in disqualification of entry.

• NO PAINT OR GLITTER ON ANY ANIMAL:

• Writing of any kind on any animal will result in forfeiture of awards and or monies.

• WEIGHING OF LIVESTOCK:

- All market livestock (Beef, Goats, Sheep, and Swine) will be allowed on grounds in assigned stalls, starting at 8:00 a.m. and MUST be in place by 6:00 p.m. Tuesday, September 26th. Animals go to their stalls on arrival and wait in line from their stalls when scales open. Animals will NOT be weighed off trailer!! Exhibitor must be present when their animal is weighed or designate a fellow youth exhibitor, in writing to the office by 5:00 p.m. Monday, September 25th

- Fair closes on Sunday October 1st at 6:00 p.m. Please stage items to be loaded and observe a 5-MINUTE loading time limit. EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS MUST BE LEFT IN PLACE UNTIL 4:30 p.m. Sunday October 1st.

• SAN BENITO COUNTY MARKET EXHIBITORS WILL BE LIMITED TO:

• <u>CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION:</u>

• BEDDING STRAW:

- NO BEDDING WILL BE FURNISHED BY THE FAIR

• NO HANDS-ON POLICY:

 All Junior Livestock Exhibitors and all projects must be under the exhibitor's care and management. Junior Exhibitors (the owner of the exhibit) are required to groom their own animals, however they may be assisted in grooming, clipping, or blocking by another junior livestock exhibitor of the San Benito County Fair. Anyone who is determined by management to require help from an adult, shall be granted such, in writing prior to the Fair. The use of professional groomers will be cause for disqualification of the exhibitor and / or animal. Disqualification consists of the withholding of premium money and ribbons, elimination from further competition and / or removal from the auction.

• LIVESTOCK SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS:

• The member fairs of the Western Fairs Association are uniting to support ethical and humane treatment of all animals exhibited at our fairs and expositions, as well as reinforcing the educational emphasis of competitive programs for animals and maintaining the highest integrity standard of all participants. Henceforth, the member fairs of the Western Fairs Association have adopted drafts of the National Show Ring Code of Ethics as proposed by the American Livestock Show and Rodeo Managers Association in June 1995 and the Code for Show Ring Ethics drafted by the International Association of Fairs and Expositions as working guidelines for member fairs. The Show Ring code of ethics expresses the belief that we should exhibit animals on their own merits and each animal should be handled properly with attention towards its needs.

• ANIMAL OWNERSHIP:

• SBCF minimum ownership requirements for 2023:

-Beef, a minimum of 120 consecutive days and must be tagged on or before May 25th - Lambs, Goats and Hog ownership requirement is a minimum of 60 consecutive days and must be tagged on or before July 28th

• PARTNER FOR A SAFE FAIR:

• The goal of the Fair Board is to present a fair that is not only fun, but safe for exhibitors and other guests. We ask that all fair livestock exhibitors and their families observe safe practices in the barns. For the protection of our exhibitors and the preservation of the pens, there is to be no climbing on the bars of the pens. Only proper electrical outlets should be used with no overloading or hazardous placement of cords. Reducing the risk of food contamination is critical. Observing the 'no food or beverage' policy in the barns is REQUIRED. Signage will be posted to remind both exhibitors and fair guests that food consumption is PROHIBITED in barns. Additionally, signage will stress the policy of guests not touching livestock. Hand washing is an essential protective practice for our exhibitors and guests alike. Postings will also be placed in and around the barns and hand washing stations. We thank our livestock exhibitors for their partnership in reducing potential risks.

• <u>REST AREAS</u>:

- All club rest areas will be in the U-Barn. First come first choice of ONE (1) stall and area in front of it. Tables and any more than two (2) chairs in the barns will be asked to move to rest area.
- <u>ICE CHESTS:</u>

2023 JUNIOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR CODE OF CONDUCT



<u>Entry Deadline</u>: August 24th Entries accepted online only until 11:59 p.m.

The following Code of Conduct has been developed by the Board of the 33rd DAA, management, staff, and volunteers to ensure a safe and comfortable environment for our exhibitors, families, and guests at the San Benito County Fair.

By submitting an entry to the Fair in the Livestock Department or any other Youth department, both the youth exhibitor and their parents / guardians and leaders who sign their forms, agree to these rules and the consequences should they be broken.

We are working to provide a place for young people to learn from their successes as well as their challenges. We understand that competition and working with animals in a new environment sometimes creates frustration. We feel that managing that frustration professionally and positively is a vital part of the learning experience. We require everyone on our grounds to always heed the following Code of Conduct during our event.

POLICY FOR EXHIBITOR CONDUCT

- Exhibitors must feed and care for their animals twice daily. Animals must be provided fresh water daily and their pens must be cleaned daily. Shavings should appear fresh and not be soaked with waste.
- Minors in possession of or being under the influence of alcohol on the Fairgrounds is prohibited and illegal. If this is suspected at any time during the Fair events, law enforcement will be contacted and the exhibitor risks removal from the grounds for the remainder of the events. Illegal drugs are NEVER allowed on the Fairgrounds.
- Smoking or vaping is not allowed in the Barns at any time or on the Fairgrounds for any exhibitor under 18 years of age.
- Any exhibitor acting violently, brandishing a weapon or item used as a weapon, fighting, or risking the safety of another exhibitor in any way, will be contacted by security / law enforcement, and removed from the grounds for the remainder of the events.
- Exhibitors must always remember they are representing their industry, their families and themselves to the public while they are at the Fair. Poor care of animals, hitting them hard enough to leave marks, excessive mess in the public areas of the barns, foul language, and loud boisterous behavior or fighting is against the code of conduct.
- Judges' decisions are final. Exhibitor will not talk back or argue with the judge or judges' decision.
- Posts on social media will be respectful to all and considerate of the Agriculture and Fair industries we are part of. Disparaging posts about Judges, staff, volunteers, or other exhibitors is against the code of conduct.

Adults have a responsibility to guide youth exhibitors by teaching, Encouraging and setting good examples.

- Respect and courtesy for other adults, leaders, staff, and volunteers is required at all times. Verbal or physical arguments between adults are not acceptable. We can teach our young people how to handle successes and frustrations with maturity and dignity. Fighting or loud arguments between adults is a violation of the code of conduct. If security or law enforcement is needed to intervene, the participating adults will be asked to leave the Fairgrounds immediately.
- Adults responsible for youth exhibitors will not carry, consume, or store alcohol in the barn area during the youth livestock show, sale and exhibit. Alcohol may be purchased from Fair vendors and / or at the JLA Auction hospitality area and enjoyed responsibly outside of the barn area. Carrying outside alcohol and / or leaving it where it is available to a minor is against the code of conduct.
- Judges' decisions are final. Parents and adults will not argue with the judge or judges' decision.
- Posts on social media will be respectful to all and considerate of the Agriculture and Fair industries we are part of. Disparaging posts about Judges, staff, volunteers, or other exhibitors is against the code of conduct.

Violation of the Code of Conduct could result in the expulsion of the exhibitor, parents, club or chapter and their animals from the Fairgrounds. This includes forfeiture of awards, auction sales and possible suspension for future Fair activities. Please be kind, be safe and represent yourself, your family, and your community in an excellent way!

4-H CLUB RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All eligibility and age limitations as per county 4-H participation Requirements (See Local Rules).
- The 4-H show uniform to be worn by all 4-H exhibitors and by helpers in individual and club groups while showing at the horse show and livestock shows shall consist of: 4-H cap (must be worn on head or be visible tucked in belt loop or pocket), white shirt or blouse (short or long sleeve). Absolutely no midriffs or sleeveless shirts are to be worn. Pants may be white or black (no acid wash) must be long enough to cover the ankles. If pants have belt loops, belt must be worn.

FFA CHAPTER RULES

- The official FFA Show Uniform to be worn by all FFA exhibitors and by helpers in individual and chapter groups while showing at fairs and livestock shows shall consist of white trousers, white dress shirt (short or long sleeves) with FFA emblem attached to the left pocket and the official FFA four-in-hand necktie. The official FFA jacket is REQUIRED; Judges will make the call for heat making jackets not required. Hats or headgear (except if showing in light horse classes) of any kind shall not be worn with the official show uniform while showing.
- Students competing in this division must be regularly enrolled in the high school vocational agriculture program and must meet the requirements, rules and regulations set up by the C.A.T.A. and the State Association of FFA.
- All entries in this division must be from projects carried as a part of the regular high school agricultural program and must be owned by the student

INDEPENDENT AND GRANGE JUNIOR EXHIBITOR RULES

- Exhibitors not affiliated with any organization can enter appropriate 4-H classes, if they meet the following requirements: Independent exhibitors must be at least 9 years old or in the 4th Grade by January 1st of current year. Exhibitors are eligible to compete / exhibit through December 31st of the year in which they turn 19 years of age
- Independent Juniors must not have been in a junior organization within one (1) year of the Fair to be eligible to participate.
- Dress code for Independent Juniors for showing livestock:
 - White or solid black jeans No acid wash
 - White shirt, long or short sleeves
 - Belt
 - Clean & polished boots or shoes No pant legs tucked in boots
 - ABSOLUTELY no midriffs or sleeveless shirts
 - All independent exhibitors will show in 4-H division

FAILURE TO FOLLOW RULES AND REGULARTIONS BELOW WILL RESULT IN FORFEITURE OF AWARDS AND/OR MONIES

- Leader / Advisor Signature Procedure:
 - Due to the online entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows: after entry closing date a list of all entries (livestock and non-livestock) for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader / FFA Advisor / Grange Leader. There will be a one-page sheet for each leader / advisor to certify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2023 fair. This signed sheet MUST be emailed, faxed, or mailed back to the fair by September 16th
- Tag Id and Scrapie Tag Numbers:
 - Tag Id Number(s) and Scrapie Tag Number(s) MUST be listed correctly on Entry Form. Animal will not be permitted to enter the Fair if number does not match entry form. NO EXCEPTIONS
 - All Sheep and Goats MUST have a Scrapie Tag. Tag will be verified.
 - All Livestock must arrive clean and in show condition
- Certificate of Drug Medication MUST be filled out, properly signed, and turned in at Receiving
- If a market animal is considered not market ready by the judge, the animal is not eligible for sale
- The exhibitor of any animal considered wild by the livestock committee will be asked to remove the animal from the fair.
- All animals must be able to be led by the exhibitor while at the fair.
- All exhibitors are responsible for cleaning, feeding, and watering their livestock until release on Sunday, October 1st.
 - Exhibitors not feeding or watering their animals will forfeit all awards and auction monies
- All market animals must be pre-tagged on specified dates. Parent and Exhibitor must be present day of tagging. In the event exhibitor and parent cannot be present, a leader or designated representative may fill in providing this change is approved by Fair management in writing two weeks prior to the tagging date.

Pre-tagging of an animal is NOT an automatic entry in the San Benito County Fair. Exhibitors must enter pre-tagged animals and pay all fees by the entry deadline to be eligible to participate in the fair.

- Three (3) entries will constitute a minimum class. Where entries are less than for a minimum class at the close of entry, the class may be cancelled or combined. This decision will be made by management and department chairs.
- Animals not sold through the auction, (breeding and feeders) MUST be removed from the grounds by 3:00 p.m. Friday, September 29th. All show birds MUST be removed from the grounds by 4:00 p.m. Sunday, October 1st.
- No practice roping or bicycles in livestock area, or anywhere during Fair.

POSTMORTEM EXAMINATIONS

• The San Benito County Fair reserves the right to perform a postmortem examination of any animal which dies at the San Benito County Fair. If required, this must be performed by an official veterinarian at the expense of the exhibitor.

San Benito County Fair Junior Livestock Auction is a Terminal Sale No Live Pickups

- The San Benito County Fair, to encourage the boys and girls of San Benito, Monterey, and Santa Cruz Counties in their livestock projects, will hold a terminal auction sale of market livestock starting at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, September 30th
- All Beef, Sheep, Swine and Market Goats that are market ready will be sold at auction. Grand Champion & Reserve Champion, Third, Fourth and Fifth place meat pens of Rabbits and Poultry, if market ready, will be sold.
- When an entry is made in the market divisions, it is automatically consigned to the San Benito County Fair Junior Livestock Auction. This pertains to market ready animals only.
- Exhibitors and their leader / advisor MUST be present at the time of sale. If owner is not present, the animal will not be sold in auction, but it will be sold at market price established for resale animals. Owner must be in official uniform per Junior Livestock Special Rules. Owners / Exhibitors may have help from another exhibitor if needed, but MUST be present
- All livestock will be weighed Tuesday, September 26th between. Each entry will be weighed only once. Substitutions will not be permitted.
- A Sales Fee of 8% will be charged by the Auction Committee on all animals sold, this includes Add-On's, to cover hauling and other expenses, including condemnation by Federal inspection.

The following will be deducted from auction check:

- \$1.00 from all Market Beef for Beef Promotion
- \$0.40 per \$100.00 gross market value (0.4%) Selling Charge from all Swine for Pork Promotion
- \$.007 per pound on lambs for sheep promotion.
- A \$13.00 charge will be withheld from each auction check for all market animals to cover cost of two (2) 4" x 6" color pictures taken of each exhibitor and animal.



- Animals will be shown and judged in show room divisions recognized by the ARBA. Divisions will be established by the number of rabbits entered in any given breed and any given variety with in that breed.
- The judge will eliminate from the show those animals which have disqualifications from competition. They will count when computing the number of rabbits shown in the class.
- It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to take the rabbit to the show table when the class is called for it to be judged. Those rabbits absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of rabbits in the class.
- Rabbits entered in a class that are the wrong sex, breed, or variety are to be eliminated from the class and the number in the class corrected accordingly.
- The exhibitor is to check the show cards at the beginning of the Rabbit Show and report any discrepancies to the Show Secretary immediately. NO CHANGES WILL BE ALLOWED DURING THE SHOW. Substitutions can only be made within the same division and breed. This must be received in writing five days prior to the show date.
- Pedigree papers or a Bill of Sale showing the required ownership period (30 days) may be used instead of a pedigree if ear number and other required entry information are shown on the Bill of Sale. This should be available upon request the day of the show.
- Rabbits are to be entered by age and weight requirements for that breed per the *Standard of Perfection*.
- Pre-entry for Showmanship is Mandatory. Animal used in showmanship MUST belong to exhibitor and be entered in one of the rabbit divisions. Exhibitor must enter online. No Late Sign Ups allowed. Rabbit RHD Protocol

• The SBCF will be following the guidelines put forth by the ARBA regarding any RHD outbreaks. The guidelines are subject to change as ARBA sees fit and could possibly change after the publication of the 2023 Guidebook. We will follow any guidelines in place as of the date of the fair. We will make all attempts to notify exhibitors of any changes. If the breeding show is cancelled, all entries will be refunded.

• IF there is a RHD outbreak, the SBCF Market Rabbit Show will NOT be cancelled. The rules will change as follows to prevent any possible exposures. Emails will be sent to market exhibitors with any updates and further instructions.

1. ALL market pens will be terminal, all pens to be processed immediately. Places 1-5 will be sold through auction and exhibitor present for sale.

2. Rabbits NOT making the sale will be included in the processing. The exhibitor will have two options. 1) They can pick up the processed pen for their own consumption. 2) The exhibitor will be paid the rate of \$75.00 per processed pen from a private treaty buyer for the processed pen.

• Latest update, October 2022 the guidelines are as follows:

ARBA Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Policy

ARBA members, judges, registrars, transporters, and vendors residing in or traveling by motor vehicle through an area of the country that is part of an active RHD outbreak are discouraged from attending ARBA sanctioned shows in other areas or having contact with other rabbit breeders for 30 days of the last RHD confirmed positive case. Clubs are encouraged to acknowledge the potential need to cancel contracts due to RHD concerns when soliciting contractors to officiate or vend at ARBA sanctioned shows.


ARBA Show Rule, SECTION15.(D):

1 – Action taken by the ARBA Board will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis depending on the circumstances noted and in accordance with the ARBA Constitution and By-Laws.

2 – Please note the following recommendations:

- a) Exhibitors should follow ARBA recommended biosecurity guidelines.
- b) Exhibitors and show officials should wash the undercarriage and tires of all vehicles and trailers before going to and after departing a show.
- c) Exhibitors residing in a state with a confirmed case of RHDV in the past 30 days should have a health certificate (CVI) issued within fourteen (14) days of the show.
- d) Use an appropriate disinfectant that will inactivate RHDV.
- e) The ARBA club show committee has the right to refuse any entry for due cause.
- f) The ARBA recommends carrying cages be cleaned prior to going to a show. The ARBA recommends the following products: kitty litter, newspaper, puppy pads or other inert products used for bedding.
- g) State and county officials may impose additional stricter sanctions / requirements.
- h) Show officials can designate additional requirements to attend an ARBA sanctioned show.
- i) If you are not comfortable with the provisions in 15.(D), please continue to maintain biosecurity at your residence.







Cash awards through 10th place

- All market sheep are entered in the Carcass Contest. No live pickups.
- All animals entered in the Carcass Contest must be shown in the market sheep classes of the exhibitor's respective division. 4-H and FFA will be judged together.
- The animals will be sold in the Junior Livestock Auction.
- Entry in the Carcass Contest will be automatic for all animals sold through the Junior Livestock Auction.
- All animals entered in this contest will be consigned to a packing house designated by the Fair.
- Carcasses will be graded at the packaging house by USDA graders and results compiled by department chairs and industry professional.
- All carcasses must grade USDA Top Select or higher to be eligible for cash awards. Results will be calculated for all market sheep entered.
- Placing will be based on grid placing; ties will be broken by yield grade and quality grade.
- The Carcass Evaluations / Awards Presentation will be held on November 1st at 6:00 p.m. in the Oaks Room.



Fair scale weight minus starting weight (at weigh-in & tag) divided by the number of days on feed equals average weight gain. Rate of gain will be ranked by the animal that highest average daily gain to the lowest.



Rules and Regulations

- Showmanship class winners of 4-H Junior, 4-H Senior and FFA Advanced Showmanship in each livestock division (Market Goats, Dairy Goats, Sheep, Swine, Beef, Dairy Cattle, Horses, Rabbit and Poultry) have the opportunity to show in the Round Robin Class in which they won.
- Exhibitors, who should win more than one species of Showmanship, must designate the species they will represent during Round Robin and notify the species Chair at that time:

No later than Friday night at 5:00 p.m. in the Fair Livestock Office.

The second-place winner of a class NOT CHOSEN BY THE WINNER will then be eligible to compete. If the second-place winner chooses not to show, we will contact the following placings in order until a designated delegate for that species is secured to ensure a full class for Round Robin.

- If an exhibitor wins both Junior and Senior 4-H Showmanship for the same species, they have the option to pick which Round Robin class to participate in. The next placed exhibitor in the class not chosen will have the opportunity to participate until the delegate for the class is secured.
- Animals to be shown for Round Robin will be chosen by the species Chair.
- Exhibitors will be assigned numbers for animals to be shown.
- Exhibitors CANNOT show their own animal.
- If a defect or injury is found by exhibitor on animal it must be mentioned to judge or Chair.
- Species shown will be Market Goats, Dairy Goats, Sheep, Swine, Beef and Dairy Cattle. No Horses, Rabbits or Poultry will be shown in the Round Robin competition; however, the winners of those species are still eligible to compete.

Species may be eliminated from competition if number

needed is not sufficient to complete a round.

The showmanship winner of that species is still eligible to compete in Round Robin.

- If an exhibitor chooses not to show a species for any reason, that person can sit out of the class and receive the highest score relative to the number of exhibitors in the class. For example, nine exhibitors = 9 score for that species not shown.
- Judge's decision will be final.
- It will be at the Judges' discretion to have an animal removed if they deem necessary for any reason.
- Tie Breakers are decided with the most number of 1st's, 2nd's, etc. If a tie still exists, then then tie will be broken by the best score in knowledge.



GUIDANCE FOR FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS STAKEHOLDERS





What is the Animal Care Program?

The California Department of Food and Agriculture's (CDFA) Animal Care Program (ACP) implements and enforces Animal Confinement laws¹ related to covered animals² raised in the state and in-state sales of covered products³ from covered animals. Animal Confinement laws established minimum confinement standards for California farms⁴ raising egg-laying hens, breeding pigs, and veal calves and made it illegal to engage in a commercial sale⁵ of covered product from covered animals if they were not raised according to those minimum standards of confinement. For pork meat, this includes meat from the immediate offspring of a covered animal (breeding pig).

Effective September 1, 2022, <u>Animal Confinement regulations outline</u> a regulatory framework of certification, registration, accreditation, and inspection for ACP to implement Health and Safety Code (HSC) sections 25990-25994, which was passed by California voters as the Proposition 12 initiative in 2018.

Which animals are included?

Egg-laying hen⁶ means any female domesticated chicken, turkey, duck, goose, or guineafowl kept for the purpose of egg production. Kept for the purpose of egg production means a sexually mature female confined for the purpose of laying eggs which are intended for use as human food.

Breeding pig⁷ means any female pig of the porcine species kept for the purpose of commercial breeding who is six (6) months or older, or pregnant. A breeding pig must be in a compliant enclosure for the duration of its production cycle⁸. "Production cycle" means the lifecycle of a commercial breeding pig for the generation of immediate offspring. A production cycle for gilts begins when they are 6 months or older and moved into an enclosure for breeding and ends when a litter of piglets is weaned. A new production cycle for sows begins when each litter of piglets is weaned.

Veal calf⁹ means any calf of the bovine species kept for the purpose of producing¹⁰ the food product described as veal. "Kept for the purpose of producing" means keeping a calf that is, or is intended to be, harvested at more than 21 days of age, or more than 150 pounds in liveweight for the production of food described, advertised, represented, identified, or labeled as veal.

What are the exceptions¹¹ to Animal Confinement minimum standards as related to 4-H, FFA, Grange, Independent, or similar youth program to Fairs and Exhibitions?

- During transportation.
- During temporary periods for animal husbandry purposes for no more than six (6) hours in any 24-hour period, and no more than 24 hours total in any 30-day period.
- During state or county fairs and similar exhibitions.
- During 4-H, FFA, Grange, Independent, or similar youth programs.

What is considered a "sale" under Animal Confinement?

Commercial sale of a covered product means to sell, exchange, barter, trade, transfer title or possession, or distribute, conditional or otherwise, in California commerce including, but not limited to, transactions by a retailer with a consumer and electronic transactions made using the internet.

The sale of a show pig which is then slaughtered at an establishment under mandatory inspection under the Federal Meat Inspection Act (FMIA) has several potential options for that pork meat which has been inspected by Food Safety and Inspection Service, United States Department of Agriculture:





- 1. Whole pork meat which is then "resold" into California commerce, such as a grocery store, is considered a "sale" under Animal Confinement. This includes whole pork meat from show pigs.
- 2. Whole pork meat which is then sold to another establishment under mandatory inspection under the FMIA, such as a food processing facility making sausage, is not considered a "sale" under Animal Confinement.
- 3. Donations¹² of whole pork meat are not considered a "sale" under Animal Confinement.

The sale of a live animal does not fall under Animal Confinement.

• For example, if a show pig is sold at a fair and then processed as custom slaughter¹³ for pork meat to be consumed only by the buyer of the live pig, then there is no sale under Animal Confinement laws and regulations because there is no commercial sale of pork meat.

I am a 4-H, FFA, Grange, Independent, or similar youth program exhibitor, leader, or parent planning to purchase show pigs from an exhibition/show breeder for the 2023 fair season, what do I need to do?

When purchasing a show pig from an exhibition/show breeder in California:

- As of January 1, 2022, all commercial breeding pigs in California are required to be raised in compliance with Animal Confinement minimum standards.
- To ensure pork meat from the show pig has access to a "resale" market, ask for self-certification or third-party certification confirming that the commercial breeding pig (dam of the show pig) was kept in compliance with Animal Confinement minimum standards.
 - Without written documentation that the show pig is an immediate offspring of a breeding pig kept in compliance with Animal Confinement, then pork meat from the show pig will not have access to the "resale" market after the fair.
 - The buyer of show pigs who processes the pigs as pork meat to be sold into the retail market in California will want this written documentation.

When purchasing a show pig from an exhibition/show breeder outside of California:

- To ensure pork meat from the show pig has access to a "resale" market, ask for self-certification or third-party certification confirming that the commercial breeding pig (dam of the show pig) was kept in compliance with Animal Confinement minimum standards.
 - Without written documentation that the show pig is an immediate offspring of a breeding pig kept in compliance with Animal Confinement, then pork meat from the show pig will not have access to the "resale" market after the fair.
 - The buyer of show pigs who processes the pigs as pork meat to be sold into the retail market in California will want this written documentation.

I am a commercial exhibition/show breeder housing breeding pigs and selling their immediate offspring to be shown in 2023 county and state fairs and similar exhibitions, what do I need to do?

When the farm keeping breeding pigs is located in California:

- As of January 1, 2022, all commercial breeding pigs in California are required to be raised in compliance with Animal Confinement minimum standards.
- To ensure pork meat from the show pigs (which are an immediate offspring of breeding pigs) can be sold in California commerce, CDFA recommends providing a self-certification or third-party certification of compliance with Animal Confinement with all show pigs sold to 4-H, FFA, Grange, Independent, or similar youth programs for the 2023 fair season.
- A self-certification or third-party certification is written documentation that the show pig is an immediate offspring of a breeding pig kept in compliance with Animal Confinement.

GUIDANCE: FAIRS & EXHIBITIONS STAKEHOLDERS 2







When the farm keeping breeding pigs is located <u>outside</u> of California:

- As of January 1, 2022, the sale of pork meat in California is required to be from a breeding pig confined according to Animal Confinement minimum standards.
- Show pigs shown and sold at a fair or exhibition may be processed for "resale" and the pork meat sold in California commerce.
- To ensure pork meat from the show pigs (which are an immediate offspring of breeding pigs) can be sold in California commerce, CDFA recommends providing a self-certification or third-party certification of compliance with Animal Confinement with all show pigs sold to 4-H, FFA, Grange, Independent, or similar youth programs for the 2023 fair season.
- A self-certification or third-party certification is written documentation that the show pig is an immediate offspring of a breeding pig kept in compliance with Animal Confinement.

I am a 4-H, FFA, Grange, Independent, or similar youth program exhibitor, leader, or parent planning to include breeding pig projects in the 2023 fair season, what do I need to do?

- Breeding pigs which are kept as part of a 4-H, FFA, Grange, Independent, or similar youth program breeding project are exempt from Animal Confinement minimum standards.
- Therefore, the commercial sale of pork meat from the breeding pig and immediate offspring of the breeding pig while she is part of a 4-H, FFA, Grange, Independent, or similar youth program breeding project, are exempt from Animal Confinement minimum standards.

I am a Fair CEO or Junior Livestock Auction Committee that manages a livestock auction, what do I need to do?

- Consider the processing options for the show pigs offered by the fair, Jr. Livestock Auction, or similar exhibition after live animals are sold:
 - 1. If the only option for buyers of show pigs at the fair or auction is custom slaughter, then no additional action will need to be taken because pork meat produced from custom slaughter cannot be resold. Therefore, there is no sale under Animal Confinement.
 - 2. If show pigs sold at the fair have the possibility of being processed through a slaughter plant under mandatory inspection under the FMIA and then the pork meat entering California commerce, a recommended best practice is to communicate directly with the slaughter plant that will be performing this service for the fair.
 - Whole pork meat from a slaughter plant under mandatory inspection under the FMIA has several options, refer to definition of "sale" under Animal Confinement above.
