- 1. Visit **http://sanbenito.fairwire.com** for the online entries home page. Entries open July 15th
- 2. Register as a "new" exhibitor. Complete the steps required for your personal information.
- 3. Click "Add Entry" and choose a "Department".
- 4. Within each department you will be asked to choose a "Class" and information pertaining to your entry
 - Refer to Guidebook for specific Class information
 - Please answer each question accurately
 - You may add additional information such as a Title or a Description about your item
 - Continue to add additional entries
 - Pay special attention to filling out your entries. Be sure that your name, address, and city
 are clear on each section. Whenever signatures on affidavits are necessary, be sure they
 are supplied. Check your department, division, and class numbers carefully with the
 Exhibitor Handbook prior to entering. Wrong department, division or class numbers
 appearing can lead to disqualification if not corrected in time. When in doubt, please don't
 hesitate to check with the Entry Office during business hours 831-628-3421 or email
 anytime entry@sanbenitocountyfair.com.
- 5. When entries are complete, follow the prompts to complete your shopping cart and pay for your entries
 - Remember! You must click "Save Cart" in order for your account to be saved
 - After "saving your cart" you may come back to pay at a later date (but don't forget!)
 - Any "carts" not paid for by September 22nd, at 11:59 pm will not be accepted!

2025 CALIFORNIA FAIRS STATE RULES

Please read the latest copy of the California State Rules at the San Benito County Fair website:

www.cdfa.ca.gov/fairsandexpositions Local Rules and Regulations

- 1. Exhibitors are expected to familiarize themselves with these rules and to abide by them. All departments in the 2025 San Benito County Fair are open to residents and producers of the 33rd District Agricultural Association (San Benito County). In case of non-residents, producer means bona fide property owners in San Benito County during 2025, the status of which will be determined by the management of the Association through inspection of the county tax records. Also, producers must regularly grow or raise the produce exhibited in San Benito County; if not, their land must be part of that owned or operated in San Benito County. All decisions will be final. Some departments have opened their entries to a wider area. Please check each department to see if other counties are eligible.
- 2. **ENTRY CLOSING DATE:** Accepted Online only. August 25th until 11:59 pm **NO refunds will be made.**
- 3. **JUDGING OF EXHIBITS:** Will occur between Sunday, September 28th October 1st. See judging schedule. American System of Judging: each judged in competition with other entries in its class unless otherwise stated. Danish System of Judging: based upon established standards of quality for each type of product; each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets that standard rather than how it compares with other exhibits.
- 4. **DAMAGE TO STOCK:** The Board of Directors will use every precaution in their power for the safe preservation of all articles and stock on exhibition, but will not be accountable for loss or damage, whatever may be the cause or the extent of damage done. Exhibitors must pay attention to their articles or animals during the Fair and at the close of the exhibition.
- 5. **PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS:** Checks will be issued for premiums as soon as possible after the close of the Fair.
- 6. **UNDELIVERED PREMIUMS FORFEITED:** All premiums awarded by the Association will be mailed to the address given on entry form. Undeliverable premiums will be forfeited to the State of California.
- 7. **UNCLAIMED AWARDS:** After 30 days, any unclaimed exhibits or awards become the property of the 33rd District Agricultural Association and may be disposed of.
- 8. **REJECTION OF EXHIBITS:** The Association reserves the right to reject any exhibit improperly entered, or when the ownership is in doubt, or <u>if required entry fees are lacking</u>, or if not properly conditioned for the show.
- 9. REMOVAL OF EXHIBIT: No exhibit will be removed before the date and time stated in the rules for each department as provided in State Rule II-14 and Auction Sales Rules. (Early removal will result in forfeiting any premiums due to the exhibitor. This rule will be rigidly enforced.) <u>Due to the possibility of loss, ribbons may not be placed on display.</u> Ribbons and premium checks will be available in the department when you pick up your exhibits.
- 10. **NO DOGS.** Exception for ADA Authorized Service Dogs are allowed.
- 11. **FINAL CLOSING:** The Fair will close Exhibits to visitors at 6:00 pm, Sunday, October 5th.
- 12. **SAN BENITO COUNTY 4-H PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS:** Membership in the University of California, San Benito County 4-H Program is open to all children in kindergarten through 19 years of age without regard to race, religion, sex or physical handicap who reside within San Benito County

school district boundaries and / or are legally in attendance at a San Benito County school. Youth residing in a county other than San Benito must have the approval of the 4-H Youth Development Advisor from their home county and the San Benito County 4-H Youth Development Advisor and the community club leader of the club he / she seeks to join. Families enrolled in a San Benito 4-H club prior to this policy being implemented, will be allowed to continue participating in the program as long as they have the approval of the 4-H Youth Development of both counties annually. SBCF recognizes all 4-H enrollment requirements.

- 13. **MONTEREY AND SANTA CRUZ COUNTY PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS:** Must be enrolled in a 4-H Club Program based in Monterey or Santa Cruz County. FFA exhibitors must be enrolled in a FFA Chapter in a Monterey or Santa Cruz school. Exhibitor must live within eligible counties to exhibit.
- 14. **FRAUDULENT ENTRIES:** If after the judges have made their awards, the Association finds that an exhibitor has improperly and falsely entered any exhibit, said exhibitor will forfeit all rights to all premiums that may have been awarded him / her in all departments of the Fair.
- 15. **LEADER / ADVISOR SIGNATURE PROCEDURE:** Due to the online entry program our process to obtain 4-H leader and FFA advisor signatures is as follows: after the entry closing date a list of all online entries (livestock and non-livestock) for each club and chapter will be emailed to the 4-H Community Leader / FFA Advisor / Grange Leader. There will be an email for each leader / advisor to verify that all entries are valid projects and eligible to exhibit at the 2025 fair. This signed sheet MUST be emailed, faxed, or postmarked by due date. (no metered mail).
- 16. STILL EXHIBIT RULE REQUIRED 2025

Attention **ALL** 4-H, Independent and FFA exhibitors!

Entering exhibits in any MARKET class: Each Market Exhibitor is required to enter and deliver at least one entry in either the 4-H Stills or FFA Stills. All entries must have been made, collected, grown or prepared within one year of the opening date of the 2025 fair.

EDUCATIONAL POSTERS DO NOT SATISFY THIS RULE

See Receiving Schedule for date, time, and location.

FAILURE TO DELIVER THE REQUIRED ENTRY WILL RESULT IN DISQUALIFICATION OF ALL MARKET ENTRIES IN THIS YEAR'S FAIR.

Animals will be sent home. No exceptions.

- NOTE: No paraffin seals, no paraffin allowed on any entry. All canning must be in sealed jars.
- Recommended Containers:
 - Fruits & Vegetables Clear glass wide or narrow mouth jars.
 - Jellies: Clear glass standard or sculptured jar, at least 4 ounces.
 - Jams: Clear glass pints or half-pints fruit jars only.
- No frozen or refrigerated products.
- Non-acid foods such as all vegetables must be canned under pressure. Low-acid fruit, such as figs, should be made more acidic by adding lemon juice, as directed in the University Agricultural Extension Service leaflet "Home Canning of Fruits". Tomatoes and fruits (not including their juices) must be processed in a boiling water bath.
- All exhibits must be cleaned and sealed. No stickers or designed / custom labels on jars.
 Fancy padded lids, fabric overwraps or cozy interferes with the judging process, do not use.
 Could result in not being judged and / or disqualification.
- Two identical entries (rubber banded together) are required in all divisions unless otherwise noted. One jar is to be opened for judging and the other will be displayed, unopened during the remainder of the Fair.



MATTING GUIDELINES

• Matting using a windowed mat:

- Windowed mats can be purchased at Aaron Brothers, Michaels, and online. Typically, an 11" x 14" inch size mat will have a window for an 8" x 10" photo, and a 16" x 20" inch mat will have a window for an 11" x 14" inch photo. Position the photo face up behind the window part of the mat.
- Once you settle on how the photo looks through the window, tape the photo to the back of the window part of the mat.
- Now use double-sided tape to adhere the window part to the back part of the mat or leave the back of the mat back off.
- Label your photo on the upper left corner when facing the back of the mat.

Matting with art-board or foam core. (Difficult to get right):

- No flush mounts allowed.
- Cut the foam core to 11" x 14" inches or 16" x 20" inches depending on your division. Use a stiff plastic or metal straight edge (T-Square or metal ruler) and sharp hobby knife or similar on a nice flat cutting board instead of a paper cutter or scissors. Watch your fingers! Try to be as neat as possible. The border of mat must be 1 2 inches on all sides.
- Position the photo on the cut foam core or art-board, making sure that it is in the center of the board both top to bottom and left to right. Mark the edges of the

- photo on the foam core lightly with a lightly penciled rectangle or dots at the 4 corners of the photo.
- Place the photo on a scrap of cardboard face down and spray the back of the photo with spray glue. You could use Elmer's non-wrinkle rubber cement/or double-sided tape. There are two types of spray glue (permanent and repositionable). If permanent, you only need to spray the back of the photo. If repositionable, spray the foam core or art board as well. To do this lightly tape paper to four sides of the foam core creating a masked window to spray the glue right where the photo will be placed. Exact alignment is important.
- Place the photo carefully on the art board starting at one edge. Wax paper can also be used to help position the photo; then can be pulled away to allow the photo to adhere to the mat.
- Carefully erase any pencil marks.
- Label your photo on the upper left corner of the back.

Concerns about hanging

 Velcro or special hanging hooks do not need to be attached to the back when matted. Photos on aluminum or canvas should have a method for hanging suitable for the size and weight of the photo.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

Photo Art

Tape an envelope to back of photo containing either a 3" x 5" or 4" x 6" of original photo or photos you used before it was altered. The photos will be displayed beside the photo art piece.

• Panorama Photos

 Try to maintain a photo height of 6 inches or more; width can vary. Mount on art board or foam core.

Humorous

 Attach 3" x 5" card with an optional humorous caption.

Flashback

 Two photos same size side by side (early photo on left, current photo on right) or a composite of both side by side.

Drone / Aerial Photography

Minimum size 8" x 10".
 Maximum size 20" on longest side
